

Y. M. C. A. WON A BIG SUIT

New York, April 17.—The Young Men's Christian Association will receive \$500,000 as a second payment from the estate of Mrs. Julia L. Butterfield of Cold Spring, as a result of a ruling of the Appellate Division yesterday, which sustained the order of Surrogate J. B. Southard at Carmel, from which Albert Francis Hager, sole executor of the estate made the appeal.

Surrogate Southard made two orders directing Hager to pay over large sums to the Y. M. C. A. Hager appealed from the first order and was beaten in the courts, and then appealed the second order. Judge Mortimer Patterson of Nyack, counsel for the Y. M. C. A., said he would make Hager remit the full amount within a few days.

and material. He had made inquiries but had found that it was impossible to reduce the amount. Of the \$38,000 there was \$16,000 that was being contributed directly by the Province to the individual purchasers of books. The Government had hesitated to advance the retail price but might have to this year.

MR. MERSEAU asked concerning the item for Survey and Inspection.

HON. MR. SMITH said there was an increase of \$2,000 in the item. Land being granted to returned soldiers as settlers was being surveyed in lots. This was expensive. There also was an estimate of \$1000 for running lines between Crown Lands and granted lands where lines never had been properly defined. It was desirable to know whether logs were being cut on Crown Lands or on private lands.

MR. TILLEY said he noticed that the grant to the Fredericton Tourist Association had been increased by \$200. The New Brunswick Tourist Association which covered the whole province had asked for an increased grant but had not received it. He would like to see the grant to the New Brunswick Association increased to \$2,000 in the supplementary estimates.

HON. MR. FOSTER said that the grant to the Fredericton Tourist Association had been increased to meet the expense of an excellent booklet covering various parts of the Province which it had issued. The New Brunswick Tourist Association was practically centred in St. John. It had asked for an additional grant. Upon inquiry he learned that that association realized no revenue among the citizens of St. John as it had a few years previously when he had been connected with it. He decided to act in accordance with the old saying. "The Lord help them who help themselves" the grant was not increased.

HON. MR. FOSTER explained that the item of \$15,000 to provide for the purchase of land for soldiers with Physical Disabilities was a revote. It had not been expended last year.

Progress was reported.

Further consideration of supply was made the order of the day for Monday at 3 o'clock.

PICKFORD CASE IN THE COURTS

Minden, Nevada, April 16.—In the interest of the state of Nevada a suit asking that the decree of divorce granted on March 2, 1920, by District Judge Langan to Gladys E. Moore, more familiarly known as Mary Pickford, from Owen E. Moore be set aside, was filed in the district court here this afternoon, by Leonard B. Fowler, attorney-General.

The complaint is based on allegations of fraud, connivance and collusion between Moore, his wife and Douglas Fairbanks, to whom the former Mrs. Moore was married a short time after her divorce was granted.

Allegations are that Moore came to Minden solely to be served summons in the suit, and that Miss Pickford concealed her identity from the judge up to the moment of taking the witness stand. As Judge Langan is one of the witnesses summoned for the state, another judge will hear the complaint.
