EGG LAYING **CONTEST WON BY** BAR ED ROCKS

Ten Birds Laid an Average of 223 Eggs in Twelve Months One Thousand Hens Took Part.

A pen of Barred Rocks from New York State won the ninth annual egglaying contest conducted by the Connecticut Agricultural College at Storrs ending Oct. 29. This is the first time on the history of the laying trials that the same breeder with the same variety of hens has been able to win two years in succession. The winning per was entered by Jules F. Francais from Westhampton Beach L. I. These ten pullets laid 2234 eggs for each hen in the pen. Steady laying during the last half of the year won this pen its place and the blue ribbon for the year It first took the lead in the twentyninth week of the contest then dropped back into second place in the thirty-fourth week; regained its lead three weeks later and held out until the end. This is the third time that Barred Rocks have outlaid all competitors as can be seen from the following list of winners and their records in the contest at Storrs during the past nine years:

ELECTIONS COST

Ottawa, Nov. 10.—Judginb by the cost of conducting the election of 1917, the cost of the plebiscite on liquor importation, taken in the four provinces simultanecasly, wil be in the neighborhood of three-quarters of a milion

or three-quarters of a minor dollars.

The provinces voting on the same day were Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Nova Srotia. Colies of the auditor general's report covering the cost of the election held in 1917 show the average cost per polling district in each of these provinces to be roughly as follows: Alberta, \$12,000 to \$15,000; Saskatchewan, \$10,000; Manitoba, \$6,000, and Nova Scotia \$4,000. In several of the districts in 1917 there were acclamations, but the above figures represent fair averages for the divisions in which the polling took place.

The districts in which there was voting under the Canada Temperance Act last month numbered fifty-seven. Of these there were twelve in Alberta, sixteen in Saskatchewan, fifteen in Manitoba and fourteen in Nova Scotia.
This would bring the cost of the 1917 election, had all the provinses voted, to roughly \$500,000 had there been voing in all disricts.

Two Barred Rock hens, Nos. 54 and 58, both from Westhampton Beach, Long Is land, tied for highest individual yield for the year with scores of 281 eggs No. 270, owned by Langford Poultry Farm, from British Columbia, finished first with a yield of 267 eggs. The best Rhode Island Red hen was No. 329 in the leading pen in this class and her record for the year was 269 eggs. 


