

How to Wash a Corset. Put the corset in cold water for a few hours.

Make ready a hot solution containing a tables poonful of borax, a table spoonful of ammonia and a tablespoonful of washing soda, to about two gallons of water.

Now take a small, stiff brush and soap it well, after which dip in coarse cornmeal.

Scrub the corset thoroughly until all the stains are removed.

Rinse well in not water, then in cold water.

Hang the corset, without any attempt at wringing, up to dry, and it will be beautifully clean and white.
