In a formal statement Mr. Roper said that he would recommend further laws on the subject to Congress when it reconvenes January 5. Representative Andrew J. Volstead, Republican of Minnesota chairman of the House Judiciary Committee expressed the belief that the legislation would be acted upon promptly by his committee at the same time urging drastic enforcement of laws already in existence in order to reduce the allarming list of fatalities due to drinking poison mixtures.
