OPERA HOUSE REDECORATED LOOKS LIKE NEW THEATRE

F. G. Spencer Limited Took Theatre Over March 1st—Operators' Booth Unsurpassed in Maritime Provinces—New Scenery on Stage and Interior Entirely Redecorated—New Lighting System and Other Improvements.

The City Opera House will reopen to the public Monday under the management of F. G. Spencer Limited. The present lessee took possession formally March 1st and the Opera House is now one of the chain of theatres which that firm operates throughout the Maritime Provinces. A six months' lease exists at present with the probability of a two years' extension.

Practically New Theatre

As a result of the improvements and renovations which have been under way for several weeks past, the Opera House is practically a new theatre and presents a most attractive appearance. It is equipped for use either as a motion-picture theatre or for the presentation of dramatic or other performances.

New Manager

A new manager will take charge of the theatre next week, R. A. Thorne of St. John already being here to represent the Spencer interests. Mr. Thorne has been connected with the Exhibitors' Distributing Agency, a film exchange. A. D. Callan who was manager of the Gem Theatre here for F. G. Spencer Limited for about two years, will remain for the first week after the opening of the Opera House. He will then return to St. John where he will be connected with one of the Spencer theatres. Since coming to Fredericton Mr. Callan has made hosts of friends who will regret that he is about to sever his connection with things theatrical in this city. He managed the Gem Theatre until it was destroyed in the disastrous fire of last December and also represented Mr. Spencer in connection with the numerous travelling companies booked for performances here through his firm.

Most Modern Booths

The most important improvement made at the Opera House has been in connection with the operator's booth for projecting motion-pictures. Formerly it was located within the auditorium upon supporting posts. It now is entirely outside the auditorium, a special installation having been made. The floor is of concrete and the interior is entirely sheathed with sheet-metal backed by asbestos. John Kenney, New Brunswick Building Inspector, after a recent inspection said the booth was the best in the Maritime Provinces with the exception of the Gaiety Theatre in this city which he

Exterior Lighting

The exterior lighting of the entrance of the Opera House has been improved by the installation of two five hundred watt lamps on brackets each side of the head of the entrance steps. The pillar lamps at the foot of the steps also will be used.

Painting Noticeable

The painting and decoration of the theatre is noticeable at once upon entering. The main doors have been repainted in most attractive manner and the walls of the lobby and side stairways also have been given the same treatment. The box-office has not been forgotten and presents a most improved appearance.

Interior Altered

The interior walls of the theatre have been entirely redecorated and the lighting system completely changed. This makes it look almost entirely different from what it did before. One hanging chandelier affords the chief light with two hanging lamps over the balcony. Beneath the balcony there are ceiling lamps in colored glass shades and bracket lamps are placed along the walls. All lights are controlled from the operators' booth where there is a dimming apparatus of recent design.

The wall are panelled in rose with borders of light blue. The coat-of-arms of New Brunswick has a prominent place over the proscenium arch. The ceiling is entirely redecorated with a handsome border design.

New Scenery Installed

Two new sets of scenery have been placed upon the stage and the old sets will be repainted. These improvements will add greatly to performances by either local or travelling companies. The screen upon which the pictures will be shown is new and will greatly improve the projection.

Future Intentions

The Opera House will reopen Monday with Mary Pickford in a feature picture. There will be two changes of program. Three changes weekly will be run except when big features are run or outside engagements offered. A program of five acts of vaudeville with a two-reel serial picture is a possibility which may become a reality in April.

Local Engagements

Satisfactory arrangements for local performances have been made. The St. Patrick's Day entertainment is the first and the Intercollegiate debate between U. N. B. and Dalhousie will follow soon afterward. A minstrel show with a big feature picture, may be put on by the I. O. D. E. The first travelling organization with a booking is The Boston English Opera Company which will appear for two nights in May.

William Vincent of St. John was the decorator whose handiwork appears in the redecorated Opera House. It is highly creditable and he is heartily congratulated upon it.
