**Status of U. N. B. Players.**  
The fact that Burgess, captain of the U. N. B. team, is a possible delegate to a league meeting, shows that the college players will not be entirely

missing from the Fredericton team this season. Burgess stated after the meeting that the Red and Black players would start the season with Fredericton and would stick out for a schedule which would not conflict with U. N. B. dates in the Intercollegiate series. If it comes to a matter of choice between the N. B. H. L. team and the Intercollegiate League team the college will have the preference every time. This seems to be a satisfactory solution of the problem. Last year the U. N. B. championship chances when they seemed to be surely within reach, slid away and too much hockey with the Fredericton team on the part of the trio Burgess, Jewett and Lounsbury, was blamed. That state of affairs should not occur again and it looks as if steps are being taken to prevent it.

## ZIONISTS FAVOR PLANS TO HELP PALESTINE

Buffalo, N. Y., Nov. 30.—The Zionist organization of America approved an extensive program for the industrial, financial and agricultural development of the new homeland for Jews in Palestine. The program was outlined in eight proposals, submitted to the delegates at the convention of the organization by the executive committee, and it was approved with only one important amendment.

The amended proposal related to Palestine investment corporation. The executive committee's original resolution pledged the organization to institute the formation in all parts of the United States of local Palestine investment loan and in public utilities and financial institutions there.

The amendment, which was adopted after a long debate, provided that official indorsement shall be given preferably to companies that agree to incorporate in their charters provisions that shall favor the employment of Jewish workmen and "shall seek the avoidance to class conflict by giving the employees a voice in the management of the corporation."

## TO TEST THE CIGARETTE LAW OF KANSAS

Topeka, Nov. 30.—The Kansas anti-cigarette law will be tested before the Supreme Court of the United States attorneys announced when the State Supreme Court allowed a writ of error which permits an appeal to the Federal court.

Immediately after the State Supreme Court's decision upholding the law, several weeks ago, Miss Lucy Page Gaston of Chicago, representative of the National Anti-Cigarette League, began a campaign in the State to have the law enforced.

Local officers have conducted raids, confiscating cigarettes and prosecuting vendors in various parts of the State, according to reports received by Richard J. Hopkins Attorney-General.

## WILL EXHIBIT N. S. APPLES

Kentville, Nov. 26.—With the departure this morning on the westbound express of W. Saxby Blair, Mayor of Kentville, and superintendent of the Experimental Station here, the start was made in what may develop into considerable importance, not only for this, but for every county in the Valley.

Mayor Blair's first stop will be at Ottawa, where he meets officials connected with the Dominion Agricultural Department. Then he proceeds to Columbus, Ohio, where he attends a meeting of the American Pomological Society, and where he will exhibit one hundred specimens of Nova Scotia apples. While in the Middle West he will also visit his brother, who is at the head of the Horticulture Department of the State University at Urbana, Illinois. He expects to be absent two weeks.

## FAKE BOOZE LABELS SEIZED

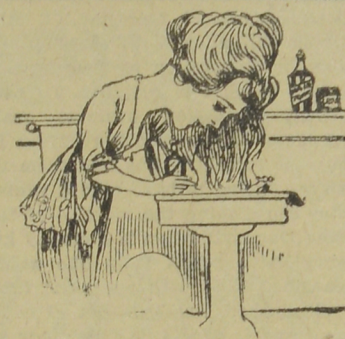
Boston, Nov. 27.—Rhode Island, particularly Providence, is the headquarters of a nationally organized gang of liquor runners and bottled in bond label counterfeiters, while the distributing point for much of the work is at New Bedford, according to statements of Federal prohibition agents, who yesterday seized hundreds of quarts of alcohol and thousands of counterfeit bottled in bond labels in the two cities.

Providence is believed to be the distributing centre for much bona fide bottled in bond whiskey, thousands of quarts of which have been stolen from warehouses all over the country and smuggled into that city.

In New Bedford more than forty agents in a series of whirlwind raids last night seized liquor valued at more than \$4,000 and unearthed what they believe is the distributing centre for the counterfeit labels and revenue stamps. The agents seized in one hotel 200 fake Government stamps and forty-nine gallons of moonshine in bottles, each bearing a counterfeit Government stamp and seal.

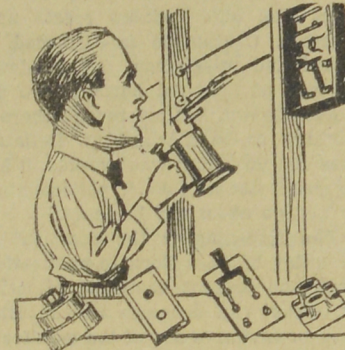

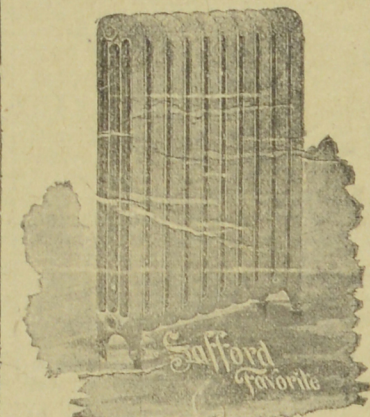
