HOW TO MAKE FUDGE CAKE

Fudge cake is one of the most delic

Here is a tested recipe.

One and one-half cups brown sugar ne-half cup butter, one-half cup milk. melted. Cream the butter and sugar to gether add the milk and eggs well beaten, then the flour and the melted chocolate. Bake in three lavers in a noderate oven Fill with the following

Filling For Fudge Cake.

Put in a saucepan one and one-hal cups granulated sugar, one-half cup cream or rich milk, one tablespoon butter, a very small pinch of salt and two squares of chocolate melted. Cook together over a brisk fire until it forms

a ball, when a little is dropped from a spoon in a cup of cold water, add

Milk loing.

Put one and one-half cups sugar and one-half cup of milk in a saucepan over the fire; do not stir after it begins to boil Allow to boil for 10 minutes then add one teaspoon of flavoring and stir BARRISTER, NOTARY, ETC. over cold water until stiff enough to spread. (This recipe is for the plain milk icing. This is much more delicious, however, if chopped nuts are added to it before it is spread on the

White Filling.

Add five tablespoons of water to one until dissolved. Cook until it forms soft ball when dropped in cold water not stirring at all while cooking, then 532 Queen Street, Fredericton, N. B. pour it slowly into the beaten white of one egg; beat constantly until cool. Add one-half teaspoon of vanilla extract and it is ready for the cake (You can make a chocolate filling of this by adding three tablespoons of round chocolate into it before putting on cake. If desired, chopped nuts nay be added, also.)

Mr. Bredin pointed out that though the price of flour jumped \$1.60 a barrel last May, there was no corresponding increase in the price of bread.
