THE PROVINCIAL ELECTION

While the Government of Hon. W.E. Foster was sustained at the polis on Saturday's contest by a slightly reduced majority, the victory won, all things considered, was one of the most remarkable achieved by any administration since Confederation. Of the 106 candidates in the field representing the government, opposition, United Farmers and independents, the government has, according to the latest reports, elected 24. the opposition 13, the farmers 9 and the inde pendents 2. The government lost in all eight seats which it held in the last House and its gains totalled five. The only gain made by the opposition led by Mr. Baxter was in the County of Restigouche, but it was made, not because of any great desire on the part of the people to endorse the opposition policy, but was the outcome of an unfortunate split in the government ranks. The agrarian movement, which has recently come into being in most of the provinces of Canada, was responsible for the loss by the government of Northumberland and Victoria and the defeat of two cabinet ministers, Hon. Robert Murray, provincial secretary treasurer, and Hon. J. F. Tweeddale, minister of agriculture, along with their running mates. The defeat of Hon. Messers Murray and Tweeddale will be regretted by friends of the administration. They are both veterans in political life and had cooperated heartily with their colleagues in giving the province the wise and progressive administration it has enjoyed since 1917. While the government lost some good men in the battle of the ballots, the opposition, as led by Mr. Baxter, has been fiterally shot to pieces. It suffered the less of four seats in St. John city and county, one in Kings, and two in Carleton, while Leader Baxter only got in by the skin of his teeth. Hon. B. Frank Smith, of patriotic potato fame, met a well deserved defeat at the hands of the farmers ticket in Carleton, while Hon. J. A. Murray, former premier and leader of the party is among the slain in Kings. Mr. Baxter is therefore to be congratulated on being the only -ex-cabinet minister, censored by a resolution of the last House who escaped being eliminated from the political map. What the opposition as a party lacked the moral courage to do, the people have done for them.
