Never-ceasing collections in the United States supply the funds; all classes, creeds and rac es are contributors.

At present, 420,000 meals are given daily to needy children, and during June and July the daily average rose 60 cents a quart. to 600,000 meals. Up to the end of September 3400 branches in Germany had distributed 42,300,000 meals at a cost of \$2,000,000. In Greater Berlin 56 kitchens and 830 food depots provide for the starving children. The meals consist of rice, flour, fats, cocoa, condensed milk, sugar, peas and
