Canon Law

The papal motto was "Semper Eadem,-Always the Same" the profession of infallibility. He intended to read extracts from the Canon Law of the Roman Catholic Church relating to the attitude of that body to citizenship and he would challenge anybody to say that the extracts were not contained in that law. This law was for the guidance of the clergy and was in effect today as it had been from its inception. One of the teachings of that law was that if there came a question of believing the Canon Law or the Holy Scriptures, it is the Scriptures which must be placed aside. That was strange doctrine but for it infallibiity was claimed.
