HINTS TO HOUSEWIVES.

Bread that is too light when put into the oven will be coarse grained.

Warm water with a very warm rinsing water and no soap will save the dishes and keep the pattern from fading.

A piece of old velvet makes a very efficient substitute for camoile leather, for polishing purposes. It is, of course, much cheaper.

Gingham is a charming summer cushion covering. Big plaids or small checks are best, although even stripes may be used successfully.

The vegetables most rich in calcium are carrots and spinach. These should enter largely into the food of children but must not be expected to serve as substitutes for milk, a fair amount of which is always needed, whatever the diet.

CANNED STRAWBERRIES.

Add six pounds of sugar to 10 quarts of berries put in canning kettle and add about one quart of water. Cook well; then set back and let stand on range until all foam dies away and then can in usual way. Be sure cans are full to the brim; now the secret is lay the cans on their side until thoroughly cold, covered with a cloth while hot. When ready to set away you will be more than delighted with the beautiful luscious red berries, full to the bottom of the can. The secret in fruit canning is: Never put the fruit in the jars until it has been set back and stopped boiling and looks clear; never put too much water in and always lay the jars on their side after being tightly sealed. This gives the fruit a chance to swell and absorb the syrup.

STRAWBERRY JAM.

To make strawberry jam, allow $\frac{3}{4}$ of pound of sugar to each pound of the fruit. Put the fruit over the fire and when berries heat through, gradually put in the sugar; as the heat draws out the juice, keep adding sugar, and when all is dissolved heat to the boiling point and boil 30 minutes, stirring carefully. Try the jam to be sure it "sets", then put into glasses and when cool, seal with paraffin. Keep in a cool dark, dry place.

REMOVING OLD WALLPAPER.

The best way to remove old wallpaper is by using a strong, hot solution of vinegar. Soak the walls well and then scrape the paper off with a blunt knife.
