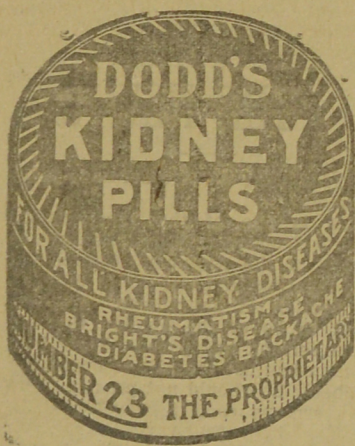

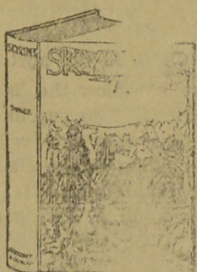

# GREAT VARIETY OF BUSINESS BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL

Action re Employment Service Bureau Postponed—Applications for Extension of Aberdeen Street to University Avenue and for Extension of Water System Along the Woodstock Road—To Acquire Pumping Station Site — Police Magistrate's Salary Increased.

The City Council in committee last night transacted a great variety of business and received delegations and petitions on several matters. Action with regard to continuing the Employment Service Bureau in this city on the basis of the Dominion paying half the cost and the Province and the city one quarter each, was deferred until additional information could be obtained. A large delegation appeared in support of a petition for the extension of the water system along Woodstock Road where "our houses recently were burned. City Engineer McDowell will report on the matter. A petition for the extension of Aberdeen Street across the C. N. R. tracks to University Avenue also was referred to the City Engineer. The Finance Committee was authorized to acquire the Pumping Station site from the province either by purchase or long term lease. This probably will mean purchase at the price of \$2,500 which has been fixed by the province. W. E. McMullen representing the Y. M. C. A. and Playground Committee requested the Council to complete the preparation of Queen's Square as a playground, estimating the cost at \$400. Notice of motion was given by Ald. Neill placing the license-fee for non-resident owners of public vehicles at \$50 and of resident owners at \$15. On the report of the Administration of Justice Committee the salary of the Police Magistrate was increased from \$500 to \$1000. In addition that official receives \$1000 as Judge of the City Court.

## Public Playground.

W. E. McMullen appeared before the Council on behalf of the Civic Playgrounds Committee asking that the City Council grant a sufficient sum to put Queen's Square in shape for recreation purposes.

Mr. McMullen reviewed briefly the work done in connection with the playground referring to the grant of \$500 which had been received and expended by the committee. Over \$800, he stated, had been raised last year by the committee which had been expended during the summer and early fall in providing an Athletic Supervisor.

and the snowplowing contractor, William Staples, who was driving the horses himself.

## Military Property Lights.

Mayor Reid said an engineering officer had called upon him recently and asked concerning the lights on the fences about the military property, Queen Street.

Ald. Cooper said that matter had been taken up at Ottawa and the visit of the officer probably resulted from that. He believed that the Militia Department would rewire the lights if the City would pay for the current, a delegation was to go to Ottawa shortly. It might take up the matter.

The subject was referred to the Lighting Committee.

## Employment Service.

Mayor Reid said that he had opened correspondence with Premier Foster on the subject of the Dominion-Provincial Employment Service. The province had refused to contribute half the cost of maintenance of the four offices at Newcastle, St. John, Moncton and Fredericton, on the ground of excessive cost. It was estimated on a new basis that the Fredericton office could be maintained for \$4,000. If the Province and the City between them would bear half the expense the burden would be \$1,000. The city had been paying the office-rent and other expenses and under the proposed arrangement the expense would be increased about \$800.
