THE HEARST PAPERS.

The Toronto Globe is of opinion that the "yellow journals" published by Hearst should be barred from Canada, and is urging parliament to take action against them. In a recent issue it went after Hearst in this fashion:

"When a lying, treacherous, strifemaker—one who has betrayed and befouled his own household, and who advertises his anxiety to embroil his neighbors in enmity and strife—makes a smirking appearance on a decent doorstep, seeking admission, something is going to happen. The healthy human, home-loving man will apply the boots. He will give the creature short shrift.

"That is how Canada ought to handle William Randolph Hearst—and all his publications. That is how Canada will handle him if her representatives in Parliament put into action the overwhelming sentiment of her people.

"Hearst is a traitor to the United States. He is the enemy of the country that gave him birth. He is the foe of the land in which he lives. When American women and children were being done to death on the high seas he was plotting and intriguing with their murderers. When American manhood was shedding its blood on the fields of France, he was serving the slayers of his countrymen. He was the chief propagandist of those who warred upon his nation's flag, and he prostituted his publications—by faked cables, distorted despatches and dishonest comment—to the cause of Kaiserism."

The style of campaign which the Hearst papers are conducting against Great Britain is shown by the following extracts from recent editorials:

There are still two-legged hybrids calling themselves Americans who clamor for an alliance with this greedy and unscrupulous international burglar and housebreaker under the guise of a League of Nations and a covenant of peace and righteousness!

What spell, what hypnotism, has hold upon some of you folks that you can still believe the honeyed professions of the only power that steadily reaches out for conquest after conquest, and that has never let treaties, neutralities, pledges or any regard at all for international decency and honor hinder its purpose to build a universal empire on the ruins of every nation on earth!

The British rule in India is and long has been a disgrace to a people claiming to be Christian, civilized and democratic. It is a rule as savage as that of the Turk in Armenia and as despotic as that of the Czar before that tyrant was hurled from his throne.

There is no doubt that Hearst is an avowed and unscrupulous enemy of everything British, and Canadians should not countenance the vicious propaganda he is carrying on. The circulation of his papers should be confined to the United States so far as this country has any jurisdiction.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

Public notice is hereby given that application will be made at the next session of the Legislative Assembly, by the City of Fredericton, for the passage of a bill or bills for the following purposes:

(a) To amend the City of Fredericton Assessment Act, 1907, and in particular section 46 thereof, so as to provide that tax notices may be mailed to ratepayers or delivered personally, as the City Treasurer may decide, under the direction of the Finance Committee.

(b) That the said Assessment Act be further amended so as to provide that all females assessed on income or property, real or personal, within the City of Fredericton, and who shall have paid their taxes within the time limited thereby by the said Act, shall be entitled to vote at City elections.

(c) For authority to make a grant for a Memorial in memory of soldiers who lost their lives during the Great War, either by way of assessment or by borrowing, as the City Council may decide.

(d) For authority to grant to the John Palmer Company, Limited, exemption from taxation for a period of twenty years from and including the year 1920; free sewerage for the same period of time under such limitation as the City Council may decide, and water for all purposes at the fixed rate of ten cents per thousand gallons, for the said period of twenty years.


