

J. E. Hetheringtoon Elected as Ministers This Morning.

The Foster Government today won and Hon. D. W. Mersereau, Minister of Agriculture, being returned without opposition in Queen's and Sunbury Counties. These, elections by acclamation were not unexpected. The only source from which opposition was ex-pected was the United Farmer Organ-ization and as the tickets representing that lost deposits in both counties in the last general election, it was not taken very seriously.

The returning officers held court in both counties this morning closing at noon. The one candidate being nominated in each case it was unnecessary to proceed farther with the byelec tions.
