WELSH RABBIT.

Bread toasted on one side. One half pound of soft cheese (mild) 1 tablespoon of butter ¼ teaspoon salt ¼ teaspoon mustard dash of red pepper. 1-3 cup of milk or cream 1 egg. Cut the cheese in small pieces. Melt the butter and add the cheese and seasonings. As the cheese melts add milk gradually stirring constantly; then add egg stiffly beaten. Serve on the untoasted side of the bread. This rabbit should be smooth and not stringy.

SALMON LOAF.

One can of salmon. Remove the bones break fish in small pieces; add one beaten egg one and one-half cups graham bread crumbs grated from the loaf. One onion cut up salt and pepper to taste one teaspoon ground mustard dash of sage dash of nutmeg. Add the liquid from fish and enough sweet milk to make soft. Dot with butter and bake until a dark brown. Serve with white sauce.

ECONOMICAL POUND CAKE

1 cup sugar 1 cup milk. 1-3 cup butter or crisco 1 egg ¼ teaspoon salt. 2 teaspoons baking powder. 2 cups flour, nutmeg and lemon favoring. Cream sugar and butter together. Then add the beaten egg. Put baking powder and salt in the flour and add first small quantity of milk, then flour until the milk and flour are in. Beat each time you put in flour or milk and your dough will be sufficiently beaten. Bake 20 minutes.

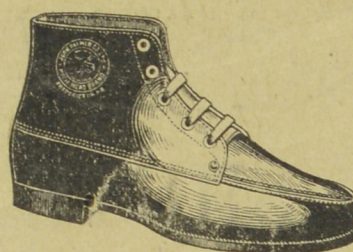

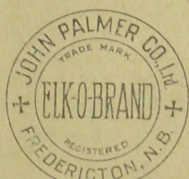
