KING'S MAY BE SEEN HERE NEXT WEEK

Negotiations Now On—Inter-collegiate Date Would Have to be Shifted—Moncton May Come.

King's College, Windsor, N. S., will send its Rugby team on tour the latter part of this week. University of New Brunswick is desirous of having the Nova Scotia team play in Fredericton. The financial arrangements are satisfactory but the difficulty is to get a satisfactory date. U. N. B. suggested the coming Friday, but King's already is booked to play Mt. Allison at Sackville on that day and Moncton at Moncton on the day following. The only arrangement King's can make is to play in Fredericton the following Monday. That would bring the date within two days of the Intercollegiate fixture between U. N. B. and Mt. Allison at Sackville the following Wednesday. An effort will be made to have Mt. Allison agree to a two days' postponement of that game. There is another Intercollegiate date between U. N. B. and Acadia at Fredericton the Wednesday following. Care will have to be taken to prevent any interference with that.

Moncton May Come

Moncton may play U. N. B. here soon on the understanding that the college team will play at Moncton after the game with Mt. Allison at Sackville. It is probable that there will be a decision on these points some time today.

FRANK POWER HAS COMPLETED LONG SEASON

Already Making Dates as Starter for Season 1921—In Three Provinces and Mane.

A resume of his season's work shows that he has started 129 races and 480 heats, and in all that work has given general satisfaction.

His First Start

Mr. Power first officiated as starter at a trotting race given in connection with a Military Gymkana held on the riding grounds at Halifax, August 26th, 1889, and has since acted at almost every prominent meeting in the maritime provinces. For years he has filled the position at the Halifax and Charlottetown annual exhibitions. His great success is due to the fact that while he brooks no delay he is particular to see the various horses, are on their stride before he gives the word, and has often told the writer that in his opinion it was more important to have horses on their stride going away than to have their noses even at the wire. He treats everybody alike, while he knows the rules thoroughly and uses the best judgment in applying them.

During the past season he introduced some innovations, one of which was the drawing of positions at 11 a. m. each day, which proved satisfactory to horsemen and spectators as it did away with the delay of drawing after the horses appeared, and thereby gave more time for racing during the afternoon.

He is now making dates for next season, and has already accepted return engagements from some of the tracks he has worked on this season. Track managers requiring the services of a competent, experienced starter for next season would do well to communicate with Mr. Power at once.

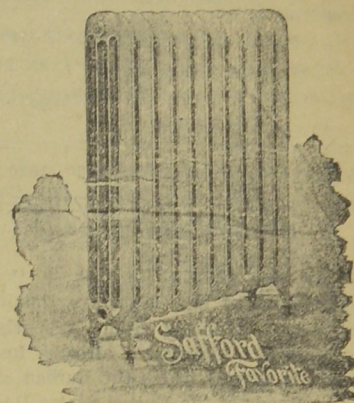

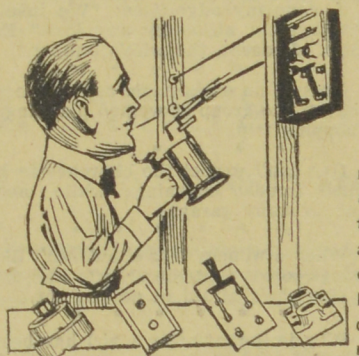
