THREE DECREES OF DIVORCE ORDERED BY HIS HONOR JUDGE CROCKET; TWO FOR RETURNED SOLDIERS

Letter Written by Defendant Wife to Husband in Germany Produced in Evidence—Sidney Albert Parker of Chipman, and Formerly of Gibson, Given Divorce—In McDonald vs. McDonald Plaintiff Names His Father, Who Died Last October, as Co-respondent—Court Adjourns Until March 29th.

Wednesday afternoon His Honor Judge Crocket ordered two decrees for divorce "a vinculo matrimonii" making three in all which he granted during the day. In the afternoon he ordered the decree in the cases of Sidney Albert Parker vs. Bertha Mabel Parker and James William Cook vs. Mamie A. Cook the former case from Minto and the other from Penobscot, King's County. At the morning session a decree of divorce was ordered to issue in the case of Fred T. Booker vs. Sadie Booker, a Carleton County case the defendant in which is now living in Lewiston, Me., as Mrs. Walter Bryant.

At the close of Wednesday's sitting court adjourned until Monday March 29.

Parker vs Parker
George Levi Chase was the last man where his mother was. He had witness in the action of Sidney Albert Parker vs. Bertha Mabel Parker. He swore that Clarence Parker and the defendant had boarded at his mother's house in Minto as man and wife.

Court gave judgement that the defendant had been guilty of adultery with Lawrence Whitlock, Fred Verner and Clarence Parker. A decree for divorce "a vinculo matrimonii" was ordered to issue.

Cook vs. Cook
G. H. Adair appeared as proctor in the action of James William Cook vs. Mamie A. Cook in which no appearance was filed for the defendant.

A second delegation appeared before the Board yesterday in the person of Dr. Foster, principal of the High School, who wished to discuss the curriculum of studies. It seems from the doctor's advice that the subject of Greek is going into disuse in the High Schools of the Province and he rather favored dropping it here and putting teacher's energies along other lines. It was a waste of energy to have ten or more hours a week to a handful of pupils studying Greek. It was decided to look into the matter.

More Insurance

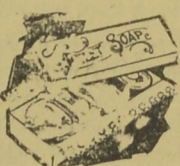
The question of Insurance of the school property has for some time engaged the attention of a committee from each school and yesterday Mr. Hughes submitted a report which was approved. This recommendation which increases the amount of insurance upon buildings and furniture to between twenty and thirty thousand dollars will include—York Street, Charlotte Street, and Smythe Street Schools.

His Honor Doubtful

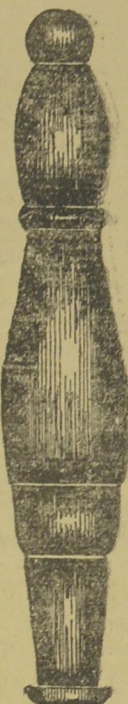
