N. B. FEDERATION OF LABOR TABLED RESOLUTION URGING CO- OPERATION ON PART OF FARMERS

Spirited Discussion Pro and Con—Resolution Congratulating Teachers' Association on Reorganization and Urging Affiliation With Labor Movement was Passed—Many Other Resolutions—Many Delegates Present.

The New Brunswick Labor Federation Wednesday afternoon devoted the greater part of the session to the passing of resolutions endorsing demands of the various local unions represented in the Federation touching upon legislation and other matters. A resolution inviting the New Brunswick Teachers' Association to affiliate with the Labor Movement was passed. This was presented by H. H. Stuart and W. J. MacNeil but a motion presented by the same endorsing Farmers' organizations and inviting cooperation with the Labor Movement met with determined opposition and was tabled without action.

Wednesday afternoon resolutions were passed endorsing:

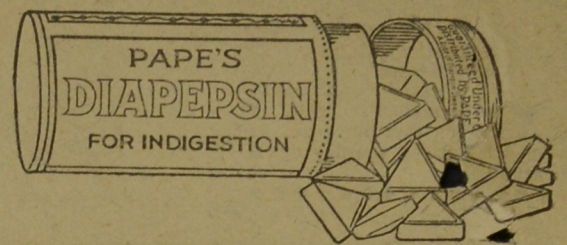
1. Milltown's demand for eight hour day without decrease of wages.

2. Fredericton's proposal to create a department of Labor as part of the Provincial Government, the latter to take over and maintain the employment service established by Federal Government, accepting Federal offer to pay one half of cost of maintaining said office.

3. Minto United Mine Workers, resolution to have a mining law passed for province obligating mine owners to instal scales for weighing all coal mined.

4. Moncton Amalgamated Central Labor Unions request for provincial legislation necessitating an eight hour day in all industries.

5. Moncton's resolution favoring establishment of Rochdale Cooperative Societies wherever possible, and that all available capital held by organized labor be invested in said movement; that the cooperative principles of owning and controlling labor's production by labor be accepted as bases of future propaganda; that Rochdale Cooperative Method is the surest, safest, quickest and most equitable way to secure full control of production by labor; and that all organized labor promote and extend the movement by

Railway Employees protest against one-man vehicles carrying more than twelve passengers.

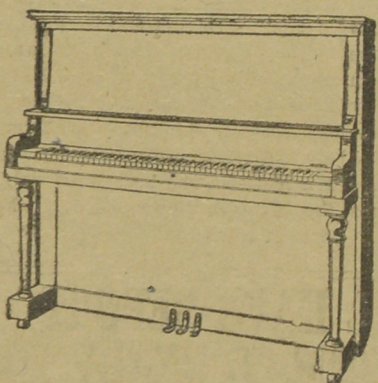
11. St. John Teamsters and Chauffeurs demand that members of owners' families driving automobiles be registered and licensed.
