"I think it is apparent that the world's inflated note issues cannot be put upon a gold basis, and the world's so-called adverse 'balance of trade could at best be so arranged but temporarily, so that to attempt either would be idle. Fir instance, all the gold in Canada would only pay the balance against us for goods we buy in the United States in six months; and after that, what? Our Government's feeble attempt to keep exchange down last month by the shipment of \$10,000,000 in gold to New York was a procedure which did not indicate very deep thought. It merely onstrated a feeling of panic, not knowledge of exchange.
