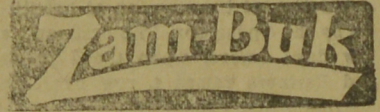

RED SYNOTT SUB-FORWARD ON U. S. OLYMPICS

Boston Players Thinned Out in Final Selection — Team Sails Tomorrow from New York.

Pittsburg, April 6—Roy D. Schooley manager of the hockey team which will represent the United States in the Olympic games at Antwerp Belgium, April 20-30, officially announced the lineup after a meeting with officials of the International Skating Union and the American Olympic committee. It is as follows:

Raymond L. Booney, Pittsburg; Cyril Widenborner, St. Paul, goal sub; Leon Tuck, Boston, and Frank Goheen, St. Paul, defense; J. E. Fitzgerald, St. Paul, defense sub; Herbert J. Drury, Pittsburg, rover; Larry McCormick, Pittsburg centre; Joseph McCarthy (captain), Pittsburg, right wing; A. J. Conroy, St. Paul, left wing; Frank Synnott, Boston, sub forward.

The team will sail from New York Wednesday April 7, aboard the steamship Finland.

This is quite a shift from the lineup as originally announced soon after the selection series of games were completed. In that one Boston was given four places, with a later announcement that Downing of Boston would also go because of the barring of Drury the result of a row with a referee.

The Boston players named in the team as first given out, were "Red" Synnott Jerry Geran, Leon Tuck and Irving Small. Alphonse LaCroix was mentioned as second choice for goal.

(Synnott is an old N. B. H. L. player hailing from Chatham. As a matter of fact an overwhelming majority of the "United States" team is composed of Canadians.)

LATE HOCKEY AT MONCTON

CANADA WILL HAVE FOUR IN BOSTON RACE

First Representatives Since Fabre Won Classic Event in 1915—All Reported Good Runners.

Boston, April 6—Canada will be strongly represented in the American Marathon of the Boston Athletic Association on Patriots' Day. Norton H. Crow secretary of the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada notified George V. Brown of the Black Bay yesterday there is considerable interest over the border in the Boston classic and that four men will wear the Maple Leaf in the event.

The most prominent entry will be Jimmy Delloro who holds the record for the Gerrard course. He will represent the Gladstone A. C.

This will be the first time that Canada has been represented in the Boston Marathon since Edouard Fabre of the Richmond A. C. of Montreal won the event in 1915.

NOTHING YET FROM MAGEE

New York, April 6—Pres. Heydler of the National League today received a letter from the attorney for Lee Magee, who has been credited with saying that he will make sensational revelations about other ball players. The letter dated last Friday, mentioned no other player, according to Heydler.

"There is nothing in the letter to bear out the sensational statements which preceded it from the West," he said. "It may be that charges involving players are being forwarded under a later date."

Pres. Heydler in his statement says that he had urged that Magee produce any evidence that he had which implicated any ball player.

JACK JOHNSON TRIES COME BACK

Calexico, Calif., April 5—Jack Johnson ex-heavyweight champion arrived at Mexicali adjoining Calexico, but across the international line in Mexico. Johnson was accompanied by his wife, his nephew and his wife's maid.

He came from Mexico City and was carrying a passport purporting to have been issued by the United States Embassy at Mexico City.

Johnson began negotiations today for a fight at Mexicali in the near future. He also signed an agreement to give an exhibition boxing match at Mexicali next Sunday. Johnson said he expected to return to the United States and "get squared" with the Federal authorities soon.

He said he would then take up his former occupation of boxing and would sign for a theatrical tour.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Under Sub-Section 2 of Section 73 of the Highway Act 1918 no motor vehicle is allowed on any highway of the Province in the Spring of the year while the frost is coming out of the ground, without permission of the Supervisor, with the exception of physicians, clergymen and ambulance drivers. Sub-section 1 of the same section of the Act forbids the carrying of loads over 3000 pounds and the hauling of portable mills on wheels between the fifteenth day of March and the fifteenth day of May, in any year, without a written permit from the Supervisor of Roads. This notice will remain in force until the Supervisor is satisfied that the road is fit for motor traffic, as applied to sub-section 2, and until arrangements be made with the Supervisor in compliance with the Act, as applied to sub-section 1.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

Public notice is hereby given that application will be made at the next session of the Legislative Assembly, by the City of Fredericton, for the passage of a bill or bills for the following purposes:

(a) To amend the City of Fredericton Assessment Act, 1907, and in particular section 46 thereof, so as to provide that tax notices may be mailed to ratepayers or delivered personally, as the City Treasurer may decide, under the direction of the Finance Committee.

(b) That the said Assessment Act be further amended so as to provide that all females assessed on income or property, real or personal, within the City of Fredericton, and who shall have paid their taxes within the time limited thereby by the said Act, shall be entitled to vote at City elections.

(c) For authority to make a grant for a Memorial in memory of soldiers who lost their lives during the Great War, either by way of assessment or by borrowing, as the City Council may decide.

(d) For authority to grant to the John Palmer Company, Limited, exemption from taxation for a period of twenty years from and including the year 1920; free sewerage for the same period of time under such limitation as the City Council may decide, and water for all purposes at the fixed rate of ten cents per thousand gallons, for the said period of twenty years.
