GREENWOOD SAYS PLOT TO DESTROY LIVERPOOL IS FOUND PART OF SINN FEIN CAMPAIGN

Great Debate in Imperial House of Commons on Irish Situation —Asquith, Opposition Leader, Makes Plea for Immediate Pacification and Stopping of Reprisals — Chief Secretary Replies, Telling of Exposure of Plots for Destruction in Britain by the Irish "Republicans."

London, Nov. 24—In his speech on the Irish situation in the House of Commons today Sir Hamar Greenwood, the chief secretary for Ireland, said detailed plans for the destruction of a large power house in Manchester and docks in Liverpool had been discovered, the Liverpool plans involving use of eight hundred pounds of high explosive gelignite at 21 points.

While the Commons was engaged in an important debate on the Irish situation, the Lords returned to the discussion of the Home Rule bill, Viscount Grey, former foreign minister being the first speaker to take the floor.

Viscount Grey declared the real cause of failure in obtaining a settlement was the differences of opinion in Ireland itself.

Debate in Commons.

London, Nov. 24—The eagerly awaited debate in the House of Commons on the Irish question was inaugurated this afternoon when former Premier Asquith leader of the opposition, moved his resolution, expressing abhorrence of the recent Dublin assassinations, condemnation of reprisals, and urging the taking of immediate steps to bring about Irish pacification. The motion was a composite resolution, combining the independent Liberal and Labor motions and sponsored by Mr. Asquith, Donald McLean and Arthur Henderson.

Mr. Asquith amplifying the subjects set forth in the resolution condemned what he termed the government's policy of reprisals, which he said had driven moderate Nationalist opinion in Ireland "into an attitude, if not of sympathy with, at least of supine indifference to, anarchic action."

The former premier declared there was only one way for escape and that the first step lay with the government. This, he said, was to discontinue the reprisals. He believed, he said, that an overwhelming majority of the Irish people and of the Crown forces had no sympathy with reprisals.

Sir Hamar Greenwood.

Answering Mr. Asquith, Sir Hamar Greenwood, the chief secretary for Ireland, was applauded and cheered on rising.

"The vast majority of the people of Ireland are not in favor of murder," he said. "They want peace and they are getting peace because the forces of the Crown are breaking the terror." Sir Hamar declared the vast majority of the Irish people were on the best of terms with the soldiers and the police.

Sir Hamar noted that Mr. Asquith had referred to the comments of a United States correspondent.

"We have certain knowledge," continued the chief secretary, "that some of these enjoy the hospitality of the murder gang itself in Ireland. They send their newspaper matter to the United States to hurt Anglo-American friendship and do their best to damage the British Empire."

"I could name these papers that have printed the most notable falsehoods, but the last election in the United States has been an adequate response. Those who set up to make

the Irish question an issue rather than Anglo-American friendship were covered with defeat."

Explosive Plots Disclosed.

Specific instructions for the manufacture of certain high explosives had been discovered, the chief secretary declared, and two carefully detailed plans for the destruction of a large power house in Manchester and of docks in Liverpool had been found. In the Liverpool case, he said, among the details were instructions regarding action at twenty-one points, involving the use of eight hundred pounds of gelignite.

The chief secretary appealed to the house to show every consideration by word and by resolution for the police, soldiers, civil servants and judges who he declared, were obeying the orders of parliament and fighting a battle against assassination and not against the Irish people. The secretary appealed especially to the "great Catholic church in Ireland," which, he said, by appeals from every altar could greatly assist in this fight against assassination.

How Plots Were Planned.

Plans for blowing up the Liverpool docks and the Manchester power and water plants are said to show that they were made in military fashion after detailed reports with drawings had been forwarded to the "Irish republican army" officers by spies at each place that was destined for destruction. The plans, which are said to have been captured when the document relating to the spreading of typhoid and glanders were captured were made public tonight after the statement of Sir Hamar Greenwood in the House of Commons. The Liverpool plans called for twenty-three officers, twenty-seven engineers and seventy-five privates and 800 pounds of a high explosive for attacking twenty-one points, most of them dock gates, with a view to stranding ships.

Diversions suggested in the report would consist of numerous fires in cotton and other warehouses, starting an hour before the other operations. Apparently every precaution was taken for dealing with the "enemy forces"—the police of both Liverpool and Manchester. The latter men dealt with the destruction of the street car power plant in Manchester serving both industries and tram lines, with hammers and explosives and also the Clayton Valley pumping station which furnishes water to a large part of the city.
