HOCKEY TALK IS BEING HEARD IN THIS VICINITY—MARYSVILLE WILL HAVE N. B. H. L. TEAM AGAIN

Fredericton Likely to Have Team but Status of U. N. B. Players in Doubt—College Athletic Association Does Not Want Intercollegiate Athletics Injured to Aid Local N. B. H. L. Team—Chester Gregory Suggests Out-and-out Professional League for Maritime Provinces

The local hockey situation has not worked itself out yet. The New Brunswick Hockey League probably will be revived but in what form is not known. Marysville is ready to put a team in with a personnel practically the same as that of the 1920 team. Fredericton is an unknown quantity although it is believed that there will be a team on the ice.

Status of U. N. B. Players.

A matter which is undecided so far is the status of U. N. B. players. As residents of Fredericton they are eligible to play with a N. B. H. L. team but the student body of the University does look with favor upon U. N. B. players being the mainstay of a Fredericton team as they were last winter. Burgess, Jewett and Lounsbury formed the scoring end of the Green and White team with the exception of Colwell. It is to the fact that those players got too much hockey that many U. N. B. men assign the cause of the failure of the local college to land the championship of the Western Section of the Intercollegiate organization. This year they do not want to see a repetition of the same thing. The Red and Black will have four players of last season around whom to build a team—Burgess, Lounsbury, Jewett, McKenzie. The only player who held a regular position last season who is not at college this year is Walter Fleet. He will be missed from the forward line but new players will have to be developed for his and other positions. It is believed that the college students will not object to the U. N. B. players playing with a Fredericton team in some games but they do not wish college athletics to suffer for the sake of helping out the city as happened last season. The question of a coach for the college hockey team also will be under consideration shortly.

Fredericton Team Likely.

A Fredericton team of some kind in the N. B. H. L. is said to be assured. There is some of last year's material available and new players may turn up.

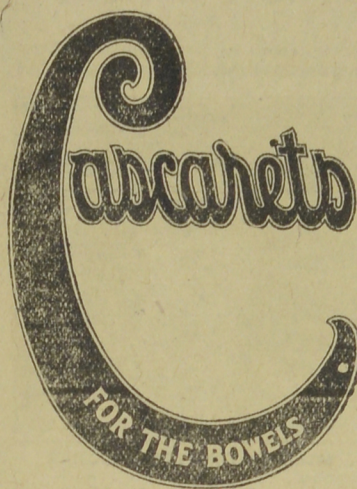
Chester Gregory's Proposal.

Such a league it was argued, would not conflict with intercollegiate or other amateur hockey and would serve to get the disguised professional out of the game. The proposition certainly has its merits.

Covey For "Clean Sheet."

The Amherst News says that A. W. Covey of St. John, Maritime president of the M. P. B. A. A. U. C. has declared that he will press for a "clean sheet" as far as registration of players is concerned, placing every player on the same basis. If this were done the status of Fred McLean of this city would be cleared up and he would be reinstated. The News has the following:—

The Town Hall was the scene of a lively discussion on the hockey situation over the noon hour. The gathering had been called for the purpose of meeting and conferring with Mr. Covey, the M. P. B. C. A. A. President. Representatives were invited from Springhill, Sackville and Oxford but none from the outside points attended. The confab was continued from half past eleven in the morning until nearly two in the afternoon, and during that time a thorough discussion of the whole situation was entered into. There were about fifteen of the leading hockey players and supporters of the town present. The main question put to Mr. Covey was "Will you recommend a clean sheet for all Maritime Provinces players, at the C. A. A. U. meeting in Winnipeg early in December? Mr. Covey finally stated that although he was personally against a clean sheet for everybody, if the Maritime Provinces would back the idea through the press of the Provinces and agree to keep amateurism strictly amateur if the idea went through, then he would fight for it at Winnipeg.

BULGARIA HAS BECOME REPENTANT

Paris, Nov. 6.—Apologies for the part Bulgaria played in the war were tendered by the new Bulgarian Ambassador, General Sawow, when he arrived in Paris. Even before presenting his credentials to the President, he invited the representatives of the press to meet him in order that he might convince them that the new Bulgaria was animated by the desire to obtain the pardon of the Entente, and especially the generosity of France.

The General's own words were: "Bulgaria now has nothing in common with the Bulgaria which joined the world war. All the politicians responsible for the war are in prison and will be court-martialled. A number who have been sentenced to death have already been shot."

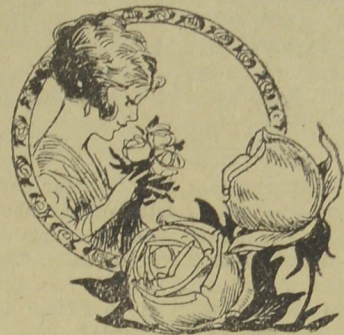
