## OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

SOMETHING ABOUT LINGERIE

Among Many Women It is One of the Most Important Matters of Everyday Life.

Among those women to whom a problem of everyday existence is the matter of finding the right raiment and that further matter of wearing it as it should be worn, the question of buying lingerie is one that can no longer be solved by itself alone. Lingerie to them is something that must always be considered in connection with the frock that it is to be worn with. The entire outfit must be planned together.

When a new evening dress is bought it means that there must be a new camisole, chemise and petticoat or bloomers. Of course we have become used to the plan of always considering shoes and stockings and jewelry in connection with the frock, but this including the underthings in the general ensemble is rather a new idea.

That probably accounts for the black lingerie that is made to be worn with black evening gowns that play such an important part in all social events this year. There was real need of them, of course, for the slightest transparency of the gown when worn with the usual white or light colored lingerie would mar the effect of the costume.

For the black dancing frock the black petticoat—a filmy lace affair of course—is practically essential, for there is always a discordant note in catching a glimpse of white or flesh colored rule beneath the black skirt.

But seldom are black underthings unrelieved by some color, or touch of metal. The newest idea is to have them embroidered with gold or silver tinsel. Camisoles have shoulder straps of silver or gold metal ribbon.

Not long ago a set of evening underthings was made of the hues of the rainbow in the softest chiffon or georgette. This sort of thing might be made to wear with several different evening frocks.

### RANDOM REMINDERS.

Velvet drapes may be cleaned with cornmeal moistened with gasoline. Lay the drape on a clean table over a sheet, and rub every portion of it evenly, working the way of the nap. Brush well and hang in the air.

A little glycerine added to the suds in which baby flannels are washed will keep the flannels soft.

You can keep silver bright by occasionally washing it in strong borax water. Let it lay in a boiling hot mixture and wash as it cools.

For a cure for squeaking boots or shoes, insert an awl carefully between the layers of leather in the sole and with the sewing machine or bicycle oil can oil the sole through the little opening thus made.

Hard cider taken daily will benefit ague or rheumatism.

If ink is accidentally spilt on a carpet, immediately put table salt over it or wash it out with sweet milk.

To relieve chilblains, take a slice of lemon, sprinkle salt over it and rub the chilblains well with it. Salt and kerosene oil is also favored. Repeat process if necessary.

### PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLU

Dr. Copeland, Commissioner of Public Health for New York City, has issued the following appeal in connection with the outbreak of influenza:

To Nurses—The city is suffering from lack of nurses. Please volunteer for service at \$6 a day or 75c. an hour. Persons with practical experience in nursing will be paid \$4 a day or 50c. an hour.

To physicians—Whenever it may be done safely, please urge your patients not to demand a trained nurse. Leave every trained nurse possible for work among the poor.

To clergymen—Advise your congregations about dangers from coughing or sneezing without covering the face with a handkerchief. Persons who find it impossible to refrain from coughing or sneezing should remain at home. Tell the congregation to avoid fear and to practice the ordinary rules of the simple life.

To the public—Observe the rules of simple living. If feverish or otherwise ill, go to bed and call a physician. The ill should not come in contact with the well.
