

SOME THINK WELLING MAY BEAT LEONARD

Will Meet Tonight in Madison Square Garden for Light-weight Title—Great Interest.

New York, Nov. 26.—Promoter Tex Rickard is making elaborate preparations for the staging of the first light-weight championship contest to a decision since the memorable Gans-Erbe fight in 1906, when Benny Leonard defended his laurels against Joe Welling of Chicago, tonight in Madison Square Garden.

There are many who give Welling more than an outside chance of winning. Frank Erbe, who reigned supreme in the lightweight division dur-

ing the Horton Law days, believes Welling will make Benny step every second of the 15 rounds. The Chicagoan is training harder than he ever did before. He is to be found every afternoon in the gym of the U. S. Training Ship Granite boxing with Jack Dempsey and several others.

Three bouts will precede the main event. The semi-windup will bring together Panama Joe Gans and Geo. Christian. The second ten rounder will show Jack Duffy, of Chicago and Jack McClelland, of California. Jimmy Powers, of Jersey City, meets Harvey Bright, of Brooklyn, in the opener of six rounds.

BOUNDARY DISPUTE ENDED

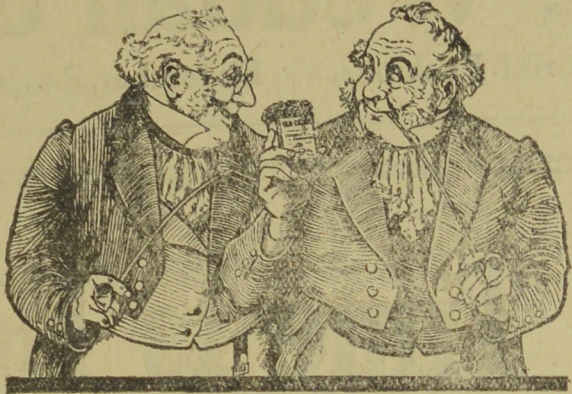
London, Nov. 25.—The signatures of the Canadian Minister of Justice and the Newfoundland Attorney General

have at last been signed to an agreement ending the long standing dispute between Canada and Newfoundland. It was sent to the Privy Council in London for settlement and it will take a year, however, before the case is settled, according to Hon. Mr. Warren, K. C., Newfoundland's Attorney General, who with Hon. C. J. Doherty K. C. for Canada, signed the agreement in London.

"The case is of most historical importance," declared Mr. Warren who has been in London for three months preparing Newfoundland's claim. "There is an almost incalculable wealth in water power, forests and minerals in the 'disputed territory' which makes the possessions a question of tremendous commercial significance."

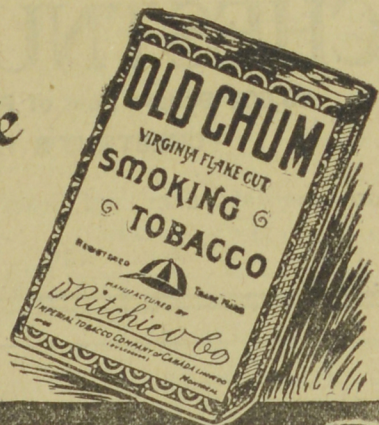

CALGARY EARL EXPECTED TO SHINE ON M. & M.

Al Sanders of Houlton, Me., Bought Him—Murphy Takes Sanardo Back for \$12,000.

New York, Nov. 26.—Prices held up well for young trotters and fast record pacers at the horse auction in Madison Square Garden. H. W. Hannan of Brooklyn paid \$3,100 for the J. Malcolm Fores yearling, Aileen C., 2.25.

H. L. Handy of Springfield, Mass., secured the year-old colt, Dr. Sharpe, by J. Malcolm Forbes, at \$1,500. Alice Scott, 2.16 1/4, a two-year-old by Peter Scott, 2.05, went to Harry Benefield of East Aurora, N. Y.

Sanardo, 2.00 1/2, went back to the Murphy stable at \$12,000, and it is generally believed that the little pacer is still owned by Franklin H. Downs of Brookline, Mass.

Calgary Earl, 2.06 1/4, was purchased at private sale for \$4,500 by Al Sanders of Houlton, Me., for racing over the Maine and Maritime circuit, where he should be the star performer.

Oro Direct, 2.04 1/4, was another that changed hands without going to the auction, George D. Sherman paying \$2,250 for him.

Ed. Sunderlin, acting for John A. McGregor, of Athol, Mass., paid \$2,500 for Dan Sedwood, 2.05 1/4, and Will Otton, the Barton, Vt., trainer, got Eva Abbe, 2.03, at \$1,950 for his patron, George La Bar. George Bush of Shelburne, Vt., paid the same for Verlie Patchen, 2.02 1/2.

Native King, 2.11 1/4, and Constantine the Great, 2.06 1/4, were bought for export to Europe.

KEEPING TABS ON CRIMINALS

Chicago, Nov. 25.—Charles Fitzmorris, new Superintendent of Police today ordered a chart prepared showing the home of every known criminal in Chicago. Patrolmen will be required to report each time a man with a record moves, and his pin will be shifted from the old address to the new.

The chart is another step in the Chief's drive to clean up Chicago which opened Saturday night and yesterday with a series of raids, in which more than 1,200 persons were arrested, scores of gambling places raided and at least two murders cleared up through identification of prisoners taken.

Seven hundred and forty-two men were still in cells today, held without bonds.
