THE UNCORSETED EFFECT.

While the uncorseted effect has been generally adopted in America, there are many women who, having lost the lithe slenderness of youth must achieve the desired silhouette by the most careful corseting. The new corsets designed for this purpose are as soft and light as possible and have discarded all but the most necessary boning. Although the tendencies of the new silhouette seem to indicate a more fitted waistline, this means little more than a slight defining of the figure, in contrast to the straight line from shoulder to hem, and not a corseted shaping of the figure.

Besides the absence of all except the few essential bones, the new corsets are remarkable for the extreme lowness of the tops and the lightness of the materials, which are, nevertheless, durable and hold their shape. The soft little things which now pass for corsets are of lovely satin or taffeta, embroidered and flower-decked. Although they look as if they possessed little power to control an unruly curve, it is amazing what persuasion is concealed in their few well-placed bones and firm elastic.

CHOCOLATE MERINGUE PIE.

Filling for one pie—One pint boiling water, 3 squares of unsweetened chocolate, 1 cup granulated sugar, 2 tablespoons of cornstarch, 2 eggs. Put the water, sugar and chocolate together in the top of a double boiler having the water beneath it boiling briskly. Let cook until the chocolate is dissolved then stir and add the cornstarch dissolved in a little cold water. When this thickens, add the well beaten egg yolks and turn out into a dish to cool. Pour this into a baked lower crust made by the following crust recipe, and cover the top of the pie with two egg whites beaten stiff and sweetened with a tablespoon of granulated sugar (whip this in with an egg beater when the whites are stiff). Put the filled pie crust into the oven for about six minutes or until the meringue is a rich brown.

LEMON JUICE.

Stir two cups of sugar into three cups of boiling water until sugar is dissolved; chill and add one cup of lemon juice. Color a deep green, using vegetable coloring that is made for such purpose. Freeze. Serve in halves of chilled canteloupe, rounding it well above the rim of melon; sprinkle with chopped pistachio nut meats. Garnish as directed in pineapple ice.
