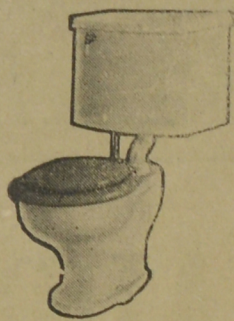

AN AMERICAN SENATOR DENOUNCES THE PROFITEERS

Declares that Greed is Rampant and is Making Bolsheviks—

The Highway Robber a Gentleman Compared With the Patrioteer and Blue Sky Plugger — Men Who Rob Others Will Rob the Government.

Washington, May 21—Senator John C. Calhoun (Cal.) issued today a denunciation of the country—stocks representing nothing but wind. In all the towns of the country can be found smooth gentlemen selling these stocks to the unsophisticated, and aided in so doing by some of the prominent citizens of the community. The people of my State, it has been estimated have been robbed of at least \$200,000,000 in sky-blue promotions. I assume the same ratio holds in other States. Some of these robbers are leaders in the community—some of them leaders in churches—loaning their names to such schemes and helping in the wholesale robbing of the people.

Grading the Offenders. "Compared to the patrioteer and the blue sky plugger, the highway robber is a Christian gentleman, and compared to men occupying high positions in churches and communities who pray with their mouths and profiteer with their hands, the holdup man is entitled to a high seat in the synagogue.

"Greed is the curse of the American people. Nearly every one seems to be trying to get while the getting is good. The jail is too good for the profiteer who is robbing his fellow man, but even jail sentences are novel.

There have been speeches made on this floor and otherwise on profiteering and of course speeches cannot solve the question, but they may help to arouse public conscience, and public conscience once aroused will brook no further trifling with this subject."

Senator Kenyon quoted W. Jett Lauck economist of the railroad brotherhoods, from reports of the Federal Trade Commission from speeches by Senator Capper and from testimony before Senate committees to show the huge profits earned by manufacturers and dealers in clothing and other necessities. Continuing, he said:

"The things that the average everyday people have to buy, clothing, food and other necessities—things that enter into their everyday existence—everything has been the vehicle through which the robber profiteers have been adding more to their already swollen incomes. It is undoubtedly a matter of proof that the average American family of five persons during the years 1916 and 1918 has been fleeced out of at least \$800 a year in corporate profiteering in the things such a family must have. And yet certain people wonder that there is unrest in this country. It is hard to speak with moderation of the coal profiteers. If there is not a Hell there ought to be one for these men. The profiteering in petroleum is almost beyond the wildest dream of imagination.

Great Profits That Escape. "Since the Supreme Court has declared that stock dividends were not the subject of an excess profit tax there has been a tremendous issue of stock dividends more than \$500,000,000 since the decision. It would seem almost disloyal at this time, when the Government is racking every field of industry for taxation, for these great corporations which have made unprecedented profits to try to escape just taxation by means of stock dividends.

"Men who will rob their fellow men as these profiteers have been doing will rob their Government. They would sell the great birthright of American citizenship for a pot of profits. Laws can curb them to some extent, but laws cannot do it all. A great

public sentiment should sweep them to total oblivion, scrap them on the junk heap of disrepute.

"Congress supposed it had given enough law to the Attorney-General to make effective a campaign against profiteering. If the law is not sufficient there is no question that Congress will enact human greed. The public conscience and spirit of America must awaken. Communities and individuals must assist in a general campaign against the profiteers. Why not organize anti-profiteering societies in the various communities of the United States and make public the doings of certain distinguished citizens who are robbing the community? If the remedy calls for sacrifice, let us make the sacrifice. If it calls for drastic action let drastic action come."
