MONTEVIDEAN EDITOR KILLED IN A DUEL

Montevideo, Uruguay, April 5—Washington Beltran, editor of the newspaper El Pais, was shot and killed in a duel today by Jose Batlle Ordonez, former President of Uruguay.

The duel took place this morning with the usual formalities and with seconds and surgeons in attendance. The weapons used were pistols. Beltran was shot in the breast and died soon afterward.

The morning newspapers printed announcements of the impending duel. They said that Baalle had sent his seconds to Beltran, challenging the journalist because of statements published in El Pais which Batlle considered offensive. Beltran was a Nationalist member of the Chamber of Deputies and a leader of that party, which is opposed to the "Batlleistas." Batlle twice had been President of Uruguay. His last term was from 1905 to 1910.

This was not the first time Jose Batlle Ordonez met an adversary on the field under the code of honor. On January 13 last he was twice wounded in the arm in a duel with swords fought with Senator Leonel Aguirre, and Alberta and Northern B. C. within

He was rendered incapable of continuing the fight a few seconds after it started and the duel was suspended.

It was said at the time that Batlle had sent his seconds to Aguirre because of an article printed in El Pais, of which Aguirre was coproprietor, changing that the former President was seeking to acquire predominance in the Chamber of Deputies to further his personal ends.

In 1906 while President of Uruguay Batlle agreed to fight a duel with Dr. Luis Alberto de Herera, a member of the Chamber of Deputies and former secretary of the legation at Washington, after Batlle's term of President had ended. Nothing so far as known ever came of the agreement.

AMERICANS INVADING WEST

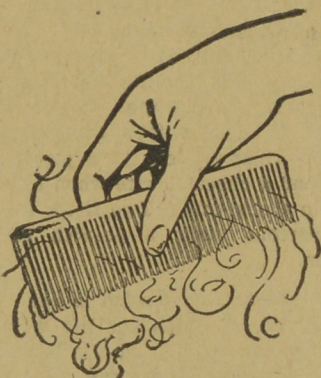

The old Court House has been used for some years as a Rowton lodging house, but it is believed to have been built more than 800 years ago by the famous Welsh chieftain Ivor Bach. Seventy years ago, whilst the Court House was being repaired, an old room was discovered in the massive walls, and some pieces of oak furniture of Tudor character was found among the lumber with which the room was filled. 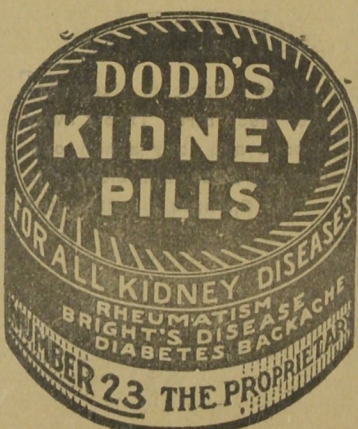

LABOR WANTS LOWER TARIFF

London, Ont., April 5—The Independent Labor party, in convention here, adopted the following as its tariff plank tonight: "That whereas the tariff issue is being forced to the front as one of the most important issues to be dealt with at the approaching Federal elections, and whereas, in respect of the fact that it is a strictly Federal issue, this convention of the Ontario Labor party must deal with it owing to the necessity of placing candidates in the field at the Federal elections;

"Therefore, be it resolved that this convention favor the following plank in the party platform: The gradual elimination of import duties on all necessities of life, such as food, clothing (including boots and shoes), and the tools and machinery, used in production, the revenue derived from these sources to be raised by a taxation of land values and luxuries."

A BONUS FOR SERVICE MEN

Washington, April 6—By a vote of 15 to 6 the Ways and Means Committee has adopted a resolution offered by Representative Longworth to report bonus legislation before another month. The resolution also declared against raising the money through a bond issue and favors obtaining it by means of a sales or luxury tax. It is estimated that the Bonus Bill, which will provide for vocational education and monetary bonuses, will provide for an expenditure much in excess of \$1,500,000,000. This legislation will be worked out in detail by the subcommittee, which will begin work next Monday.

Sentiment in the country favors regarding the service men, reports received by Republican leaders indicate Senator Lodge returned today from a vacation spent in Massachusetts and said he considered the passage of bonuses legislation inevitable.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Under Sub-Section 2 of Section 78 of the Highway Act 1914 no motor vehicle is allowed on any highway of the Province in the Spring of the year while the frost is coming out of the ground, without permission of the Supervisor, with the exception of physicians, clergymen and ambulance drivers. Sub-section 1 of the same section of the Act forbids the carrying of loads over 3000 pounds and the hauling of portable mills on wheels between the fifteenth day of March and the fifteenth day of May, in any year, without a written permit from the Supervisor of Roads. This notice will remain in force until the Supervisor is satisfied that the road is fit for motor traffic, as applied to sub-section 2, and until arrangement be made with the Supervisor in compliance with the Act, as applied to sub-section 1.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

Public notice is hereby given that application will be made at the next session of the Legislative Assembly, by the City of Fredericton, for the passage of a bill or bills for the following purposes:

(a) To amend the City of Fredericton Assessment Act, 1907, and in particular section 46 thereof, so as to provide that tax notices may be mailed to ratepayers or delivered personally, as the City Treasurer may decide, under the direction of the Finance Committee.

(b) That the said Assessment Act be further amended so as to provide that all females assessed on income or property, real or personal, within the City of Fredericton, and who shall have paid their taxes within the time limited therefor by the said Act, shall be entitled to vote at City elections.

(c) For authority to make a grant for a Memorial in memory of soldiers who lost their lives during the Great War, either by way of assessment or by borrowing, as the City Council may decide.

(d) For authority to grant to the John Palmer Company, Limited, exemption from taxation for a period of twenty years from and including the year 1920; free sewerage for the same period of time under such limitation as the City Council may decide, and water for all purposes at the fixed rate of ten cents per thousand gallons, for the said period of twenty years.

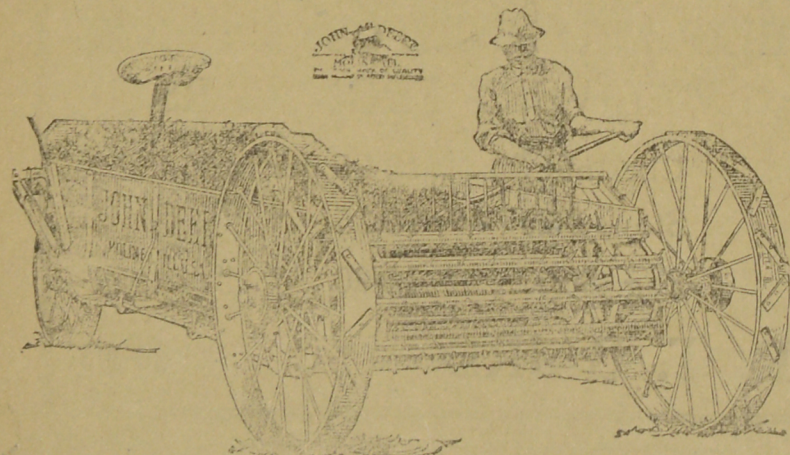
