

# TRADE BOYCOTT AGAIN IS BEING CARRIED ON

Is In Reality a Religious War Between the North and South of Ireland—Similar Situation Develops Every Time a Home Rule Bill is Thrown Out—A Ring of Determination in the Present Boycott.

Dublin, Oct. 18: (By Mail)—In the past there have been many spasmodic attempts on the part of Southern and Western Ireland to boycott Belfast. Every time a Home Rule Bill has been thrown out or when in an access of religious enthusiasm the Orangemen have fallen on their Catholic neighbors and beaten them or deprived them of their employment. Catholics in the rest of Ireland have shown their resentment by calling a stoppage of trade with the Northern city. These stoppages have lasted for a time and have financially hurt many northern merchants. But a few months invariably found trade relations again in full swing. Not of this ephemeral kind is the present boycott campaign against Belfast. Indeed in a long experience I have never known feeling so thoroughly aroused as it is at present at the fact that several thousands of Roman Catholic workmen are prohibited solely by reason of their religion from attending to their usual avocations.

## A Religious War

That it is in reality a religious war no one doubts. The pretence that it is because they are Sinn Feiners and as such sympathizers with crime and murder is admittedly only so much camouflage. And it is not the Southern Catholics alone who are moved. The Dublin and provincial newspapers daily contain protests from Southern and Western Protestants who denounce the unholy war against Catholics in Belfast and bear testimony to the good relationships which have existed between them and their overwhelmingly numerous Catholic neighbors.

There is a ring of determination in the boycott which one cannot fail to note. It is being systematically organized from a head office in Belfast itself. It is apparently associated with Sinn Fein and the thing is done with the thoroughness which marks every thing that Sinn Fein does. Instance this paragraph from an advertisement in the newspaper addressed to Irish traders as a body.

"In view of the Decree passed by Dail Eireann making it illegal to impose any political or religious test to

any person in the course of their employment or business, and as this Decree has been, and is being violated in Belfast, it has been decided by the public bodies and traders in Republican Ireland to put in force an economic boycott of that City until such time as the commercial men and firms of Belfast take action to bring pressure to bear on those responsible for the present conditions there; to restore the normal state of employment business and social conditions previously obtaining in their city and in other parts of Ireland."

## A White List

It is intended to make lists including every trader of importance in Belfast and to issue licenses to those considered to be immune from any connection with the so-called "pogroms" against Catholics. A "white list" will be afterwards published of those who "show by their actions that they have not taken any part in the present program and have shown their disapproval of it."

The boycott is against "Belfast and district" which has been defined as the postal areas of Belfast, Lisburn, Newtownards, Banbridge and Dunmore. No goods shall be purchased from firms whose headquarters are in this district or any branches of such firms wherever situated, or any agencies operating from this district. Working men and railway employees are invited to cooperate by not handling goods from these areas. Banks in the district are especially pointed to and their branches in the country are to be boycotted. These plans are already being vigilantly carried out. Meetings are to be raised to maintain the sufferers, not only those who are prevented from working, but those who have had their property wrecked and looted in the recent rioting. There will undoubtedly be a big response to the call and it will not, so far as the south and west are concerned, be confined to Catholics but all religions will subscribe largely.

Such a campaign is bound ultimately very seriously to affect Belfast trade. But worse than that is the feeling of antipathy which it will engender. It will arouse in hundreds of thousands of people in the south and west a feeling of hatred which they

## HIDES LOWER, SHOES HIGHER

New York, Oct. 23—Although the price of hides has dropped 50 per cent toward prewar levels in the last six months, the price of leather and shoes will not reflect this decrease for some time, owing to high labor and other production costs, according to a statement made yesterday by L. D. H. Weld, manager of the Commercial Research Department of Swift & Co. Further declines on the price of hides would have very little effect on the price of shoes, Mr. Weld said.  
In explanation of the slump in hide prices, Mr. Weld said that shoe dealers

have shortened their purchases and manufacturers are not making such large leather purchases. Hides, therefore, are accumulating.

Another factor in the variation of hides prices is lack of power to control them. Mr. Weld said every packer is in active competition in obtaining hides and sales are made as rapidly as a market appears.


The price of leather, he said, has dropped about 25 or 30 per cent, and that of shoes about 10 or 15 per cent.
