## OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

### FASHIONS IN BRIEF

Short sleeves are shown on many silk frocks for fall.

For the coming season copper-toned embroidery is to be in high favor.

Lacquered ribbons and braids are appearing on many new models for fall.

The vogue for embroidery continues, especially in the bright colors on dark suits.

Many lace dresses are worn, in black as well as in white, made in tunic style, wide flouncings being used in preference to narrow laces.

There is a prediction, backed up by many French models, that we are to have suits with extremely long coats particularly in suits designed for the older women and the stout women.

### HINTS TO HOUSEWIVES.

Oranges and chopped nuts with lettuce hearts and French dressing make an excellent salad.

In baking lemon pies put the lemon juice in last and the mixture will always thicken properly.

Never put dishes with egg on or egg beater in hot water; it sets the egg.

When cooking a custard or heating milk, rinse pan in water before using and the milk will not stick to the bottom.

Two bricks covered with cretonne to match the porch cushions make serviceable book ends or paper weights for porch tables.

When breakfast cereal adheres to the pan in cooking, pour cold water into the pan after emptying and set on a hot stove for a few minutes.

When basting a hem or a tuck that requires constant measuring if you are using a tape measure, stick a pin across the tape at the number desired and much time will be saved.

For lunches, if twine off packages, oiled paper from inside of cracker and cereal boxes, cardboard boxes that come in miscellaneous, and unsoiled pieces of wrapping-paper are kept together in a bag or box in the kitchen, the lunch, whether prepared for the school-children, the workman, or pleasure seeker, is a neat as well as sanitary meal.

### ONE EGG DROP CAKES

One-third cup fat, one cup sugar, one egg, one-half cup milk, one and one-half cups flour, three teaspoons baking powder, one-half teaspoon vanilla, one-half teaspoon lemon extract. Cream the fat, add the sugar, continue creaming for one minute, add all the rest of the ingredients and beat vigorously for three minutes. Fill well buttered muffin pan half full and bake in a moderate oven for 20 minutes.

### ALMOND STICKS.

Roll plain pastry as thin as possible. Cut in strips three and one-half inches long and one and one-half inches wide. Brush over with slightly beaten white of egg and sprinkle thickly with blanched and finely shredded almonds and powdered sugar; add a sprinkle of cinnamon and arrange sticks on a baking sheet and bake in a hot oven until delicately browned. These may be prepared Saturday and will keep crisp if kept in a cool, dry place.

## MOTOR BOATS TO GET SMUGGLERS

Sarnia, July 10—As the result of activity on the part of the License Department and the reports that rum-runners are growing bolder on the St. Clair River, it was stated here tonight by the local authorities that a volunteer fleet of fast motor boats is to be used by United States prohibition enforcement agents in waging a relentless warfare against international whiskey smugglers. Plans to that end are being prepared by James J. Jordan, chief agent at Detroit, and a call has been sent out for volunteers with speed boats. He expects to have volunteer patrols in operation on the Detroit River by the middle of July, and later they will be extended to Lake St. Clair and River St. Clair. The plans as outlined call for an initial force of six boats. Only the fastest boats on the river, with trustworthy pilots, will be accepted, and the pilots will be appointed deputies.

## GOVERNOR COX WILL NOT RESIGN

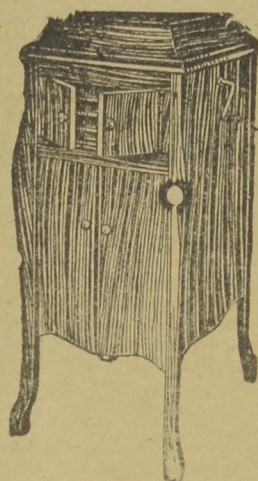

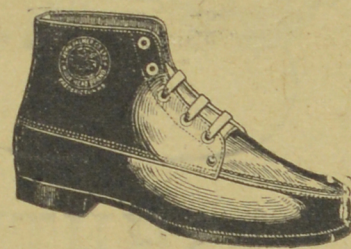

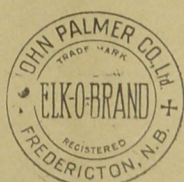
