Brage, like Bill Sharen, is a provin ial bred, being sired by Baring, 2.1214 iam Jessie Rampart, by Rampart both wned bw R. H. Edwards. Brage who was foaled in Halifax in 1912 was de reloped trained and driven by Frank Boutilier, and a brief summary of the nistory of the horse speaks in plain out eloquent terms of the success he has achieved with him.

Brage was the champion two year old of 1914; he lowered the three-year old trotting record for the Provinces to 2.20 1/4 i n1915; he lowered the four year old stallion record for the Prorinces to 2.181/4 in 1916; two years ater he trotted in 2.161/4, then the astest mile by a trotting stallfon bred in the Maritime Provinces; last year ne still further lowered that record o 2.111/2, sharing the honors with Bill haren in the fastest four heat race ever trotted in the Provinces, 2.111/2, 2.111/4, 2.111/4, 2.121/2.

The sale of Brage, following that of Bill Sharen shows that the class of aorses being bred in the Provinces are attracting the attention of the most prominent turimen in America.
