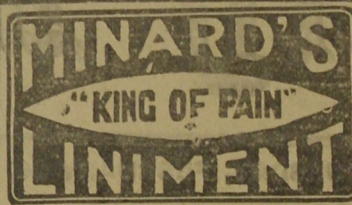

## ST. FRANCIS LOOKS LIKE COMPETITOR

Result Tonight Will Determine  
Whether U. N. B. Will Have  
Western College Title Clear.

St. Francis Xavier looks like the college which will hold honors in hockey on behalf of Nova Scotia. The refusal of Dalhousie to operate a team under intercollegiate regulations puts that university out of the running. The victory of St. F. X. over King's although by the narrow margin of one goal gives the Antigonish college the claim.

### Decision Tonight

The U. N. B.-Acadia game here tonight at the Arctic Rink will decide whether U. N. B. is to have the Western Intercollegiate title by straight victories or by play-off with Acadia. The chance of the latter to win and thus tie the league is considered slim although the Red and Blue is stronger than it was and has displayed scoring ability, notably against Mount A. at Wolfville. The large ice surface should aid U. N. B.

### What is the Answer?

The University of New Brunswick has scored two wins over Mt. Allison—9 to 2 at Sackville and 7 to 1 at Fredericton. It also has a win over Acadia at Wolfville 3 to 2. Acadia beat Mount A 11 to 5 at Wolfville but won by default at Sackville. King's beat Mt. Allison 6 to 2 at Windsor and was beaten 8 to 7 at Antigonish by St. Francis. Where does U. N. B. fit in with St. F. X. on that basis? From the road it would look as if the Red and Black would stand a pretty good chance for the Maritime title.

Chester Gregory Coaching St. F. Chester Gregory of New Glasgow is reported to have been coaching St. Francis. Gregory was well known in Fredericton in the days of the old Moncton Vics. Rev. Hugh John MacDonald also has been coaching the team.

Already there is talk in Amherst of having the U. N. B.-St. Francis play-off in that town if the influenza ban is raised in time.

## STEEL ARCHES FOR THE REBUILT BATHURST RINK

A meeting of the directors of the Bathurst Hockey and Skating Rink was held recently in Bathurst to enquire into the destruction of the roof of the new rink and a meeting of the shareholders was also held for the same purpose. After receiving various reports it was decided that no blame could be placed upon the engineer or building committee, but that the accident was caused by the excessive weight of snow which lodged upon one side of the roof, owing to the course of the severe snow storm. All of the directors and shareholders were of the view that the rink had been a complete success and it was decided to salvage the damaged parts as quickly as possible and proceed to erect a new roof. It was also decided to construct the arches of steel and tenders will be called for that purpose. The stock of the company was increased to \$60,000 of which \$30,000 will be common and \$10,000 preferred stock.

## QUESTIONS ON ORDER PAPER AT OTTAWA

Ottawa, Feb. 25.—The last has not been heard of the Guelph novitate affair which was the subject of an inquiry and report by a royal commission last fall. Sir Sam Hughes has given notice of motion asking the Commons to declare that Major Hirsch and Capt. Macaulay, in the conduct of the so-called "raid" displayed the fullest observance of the orders of their superiors and carried out these orders satisfactorily and with tact and discretion. Sir Sam has another notice calling for amendment to the Civil Service Act so as to return patronage to members of parliament and defeated candidates. J. H. Sinclair will ask if it is the intention of the government to restore the law making bank notes redeemable in gold.

Montreal Middleweight Showing Better All the Time—  
Ahearn Lasted 2 Minutes.

Montreal, Feb. 25.—Middleweights, with records long enough to provide a good evening's reading who have visited this city in the last three weeks, will soon be spreading the news all over the United States that Montreal has a middle-weight title aspirant who is knocking them all cold.

Eugene Brosseau is well known in fistic circles as the Canadian middle-weight titleholder but many who have seen him in action retained a certain dubiousness as to the legality of his claim for the world's middleweight title now held by Mike O'Dowd. After seeing the way Brosseau despatched Young Jack Ahearn of Syracuse, a stablemate of O'Dowd's, to slumberland in less than two minutes of the first round at the Monument National they lost any doubt as to Brosseau's ability to punch, following his illness.

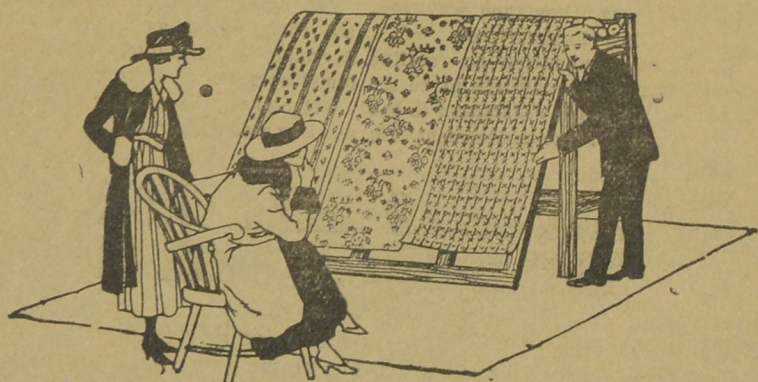
