GUIDE HARRY ALLEN MAKES A BIG HIT WITH FISH AND GAME DEVOTEES AT CLEVELAND, OHIO

Audience Enthusiastic
And none were disappointed. Guide Allen's running fire descriptions of the wild life scenes that flashed on the screen through six reels were so vivid that there was a continual undercurrent of "ohs" and "ahs" to be heard throughout the hall.

The audience was so enthusiastic in response to appeals for new members that it turned in a total of 529 filled-in application blanks for 1920 membership in the Northern Ohio Fish and Game Protective Association under the auspices of which the rally was held. This total more than defrayed expenses of the meeting and left a tidy sum to be used in the furtherance of fish and game preservation and propagation in the northern Ohio district.

Some Fine Pictures

Not all of Guide Allen's pictures were of the wild life of the northern woods and streams. He showed some excellent views of the way timber is floated down the swift streams of New Brunswick to the big paper mills and these depicted the daring of the loggers and lumber jacks while they risked death in riding logs through tumbling rapids. The vast undeveloped water power on the St. John river and other streams brought clearly to all the commercial possibilities which in future years will be utilized.

In opening his talk the big guide

remarked that there are 20,000 square miles of forests and virgin country in New Brunswick which is roamed by moose, deer, bear and lesser wild animals, while the streams provide unparalleled angling for that great pair of game fishes, salmon and trout. He told of the New Brunswick Guides' Association and described the methods for organizing hunting parties to be taken to any part of this vast domain.

Perhaps the picture which brought the most applause was the scenes of the roping of three bears which had been treed. While the crowd held its breath a man climbed the tree and, between vicious lunges of a bear he succeeded in getting the loop of a rope around a hind leg. Then the bear was pulled to earth and while it rushed first at one of the four men and then another other loops were flung about its legs until it was tightly trussed and then tied to a pole. This process was repeated on the two remaining bears until all were rendered helpless. Then they were toted to a bear pen.

Fishing on the St. John River

Not the least interesting were the films of salmon fishing on the St. John river. Scene after scene showed the anglers whipping the swift waters with the double hook flies until the strike came. Then the playing of the big fish was shown. His rushes and leaps into the air kept the blood racing in your veins until he was brought to gaff. The largest salmon landed was a fourteen-pounder, which Guide Allen captured.

There were views of moose in Salmon Brook lake where the picture operator was brought within a few feet of more than one big animal as it was swimming to shore. In one scene Guide Allen roped a moose from his canoe and with his companion, was jerked into the lake in consequence.

Metcalfe being engaged in the state trial. The Chief Justice read the court's decision, after reviewing the trial of R. B. Russell which he said the trial had been fair. "People could not get any other meaning from Ivens' speech," he said "than that it was contempt of court that Russell had been unjustly dealt with and that Justice Metcalfe had been an unjust judge."

WM. IVENS IS GUILTY OF CONTEMPT

Winnipeg, Feb. 26—William Ivens was declared guilty of contempt of court by a full court of the King's Bench today and was bound over for three months under a bond of \$1,000 on his own undertaking, to refrain from further criticism of the court. In rendering the decision the court declared Ivens had "scandalized the court and Mr. Justice Metcalfe and had prejudiced the state trial now being heard."

Ivens' conviction was based on a speech he made December 28 at a meeting of the labor church in which he declared "Bob Russell was tried by a poisoned judge, a poisoned jury and was the victim of a poisoned sentence."

Chief Justice Mathers and Mr. Justice Prendergast were the only Justices in the court, Justice Galt being absent through illness, and Justice

Notice is hereby given that a bill will be presented at the next Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick on behalf of the Town of Devon, for the purpose of enabling the said Town to obtain an additional supply of water for use in the said Town, and for that purpose that authority be given to acquire by purchase, lease or expropriation any source of water supply within the limits of said Town and within four miles thereof, together with the lands upon which the water is situate and bordering same; also, such lands or easements as may be necessary for conveying said water to the said Town; also the power to issue debentures and borrow money to meet the expense of same.

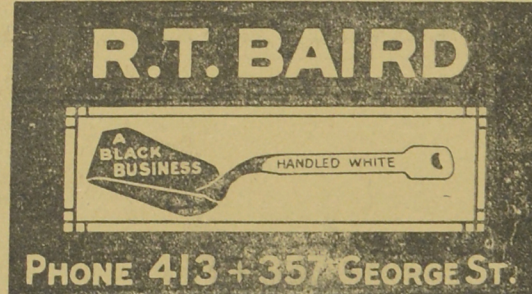
