Assembly Chamber

March 16, 1920.

The House met at 3 o'clock.

HON. MR. VENIOT introduced a bill to repeal the several Acts relating to several streets and sidewalks in the Parish of Woodstock; also a Bill to make further provision for permanent bridges and works of a permanent character.

HON. MR. FOSTER, on the order of the day being called, rose to continue the debate on the address. He said that he wished to express his appreciation of the sentiments which had been voiced by the hon. mover and seconder. It had been said that no good purpose was served by the debate on the address but he did not agree with that, as he felt that it gave hon. members an opportunity to discuss the policy of the Government and other matters of public interests. In regard to the mover of the address he had known him for many years as a personal and political friend and had always found his views on public questions of great value. As for the seconder of the address his acquaintance with him had not been lengthy but he recognized in him one of the young men of the Liberal party who brought to the House sound judgment and common sense. The County of Kent had sent many able men to the Legislature and also

to the larger sphere of Dominion politics, and it was represented in the mother of parliaments by a son of great ability in the person of the Chancellor of the Exchequer who had rendered such great service during the War. The County of Westmorland had also given many eminent men to the public life of the Country and its traditions were well maintained in the gentlemen who had moved the address. He wished to extend his congratulations also to hon. leader of the opposition but was doubtful as to

The Prince's Visit.

The Speech of His Honour referred to the visit to the Province during recess of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and His Excellency the Duke of Devonshire. The Dominion has been honored by His Royal Highness first having set foot on Canadian soil in the Province of New Brunswick. It was a matter of regret to the Government that his stay in the Province was so short and that an opportunity was not afforded of acquainting him with its beauties and natural advantages. The Government had asked that he remain at least two days in order that he might visit the Capital and come in personal contact with more of its subjects. Unfortunately the province, as he had pointed out before did not possess the facilities for the entertainment of distinguished visitors, and those in charge of the arrangements for the itinerary had advanced that as one of the reasons for the shortness of his visit. The visit of the Prince was greatly appreciated by the people of the Province and there was accorded to him complete evidence of devotion, attachment and loyalty. The welcome accorded him came from all classes and was extended not only to the Prince but to what he represented—the Throne of the mightiest power ever known. Personal contact and acquaintance with His Royal Highness was one of the privileges of his (Foster's) position, and the Royal visitors magnetic personality and his great interest in every thing pertaining to the public welfare, had won his admiration. He felt sure that the Prince's visit would do much to strengthen the bonds of Empire and he hoped that he would return to the Province on some future occasion. The farewell at Halifax which he had attended was a gathering long to be remembered and it was a matter of pride to all Canadians that as the Prince left he carried with him the affections of all. The Prince had been accompanied to the Province by His Excellency the Governor General. His Excellency since the occasion of his first visit had always shown a keen interest in the affairs of the Province and its people and he (Foster) trusted that he would find it convenient to again visit New Brunswick before his term of office expired.

Lord Jellicoe's Visit.

He wished to make reference to the visit to the Province of another whose name was known throughout the English speaking world. He had reference to Viscount Jellicoe, Admiral of the Fleet. Admiral Jellicoe commanded the

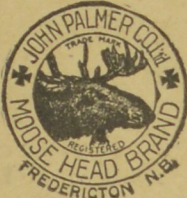

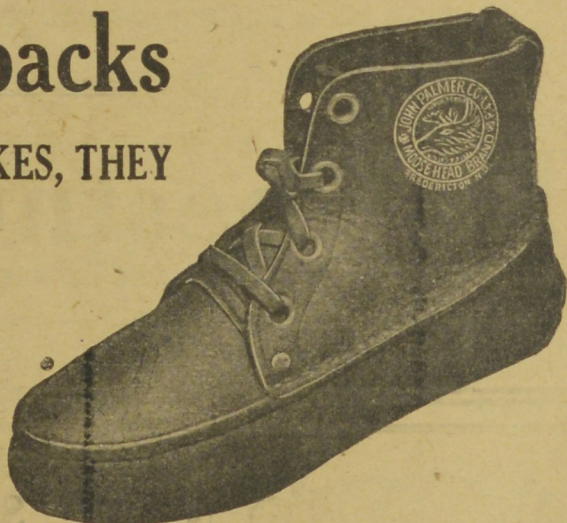
