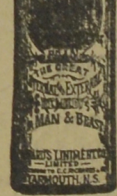

PLAN TO BE PRESENT

POLITICIAN'S EYE GOUGED

New York, Sept. 4—Two indictments were returned yesterday by the August Grand Jury of New York county against Patrolman Henry J. Coleman of the West Thirty-seventh st. police station, each alleging assault in the first and second degree. He was accused of beating and gouging out the right eye of Michael H. Taylor, 25 years old, of 213 West 120th street, and of assaulting and gouging out the right eye of Harry Jaffe, 23 years old of 176 East 123d street.

A bench warrant was issued and through his superior officers Coleman was notified to appear before Judge John F. McIntyre in General Sessions at 10.30 o'clock today. He was notified that bail in \$1,000 will be required. The alleged assaults took place May 22 and June 6.

CREW OF DISABLED SUBMARINE SAFE

Philadelphia, Sept. 3—Radio messages flashed from the army transport General Goethals to the Philadelphia navy yard, via Cape May, early today told of the rescue of the officers and crew of the submarine S-8 after they had spent nearly two days locked in the disabled vessel beneath the Atlantic ocean, fifty five miles south of Cape Henlopen.

The wireless did not tell how the rescue had been effected or what vessels beside the Alanthus and General Goethals, if any, had assisted. It merely told that all were safe aboard the Alanthus. None had been injured although all had suffered for lack of air. It was one o'clock when the first man was taken off the submarine and more than two hours later before Lieut. Commander Cooke left his vessel.

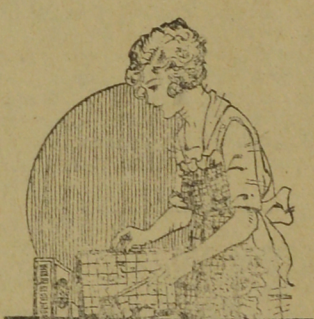

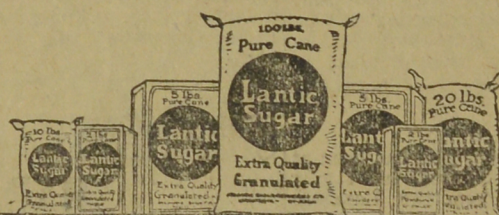
