HOT WEATHER SALADS.

A salad always is necessary for a well-balanced dinner, but during the hot summer months they are more appetizing than ever. Here are some special hot weather salads:

Cucumber Salad.

Cut a thick slice from both ends of cucumbers and pare, then cut in 34inch slices. Cut these round and round to form ribbons, using a small, sharp knife. Plunge into cold water and let stand 30 minutes. Drain thoroughly, arrange on a bed of lettuce and pour English dressing over it.

Baked Bean Salad.

Put two cups cold baked beans with one cup chopped boiled beets, sprink le one tablespoon olives over the mixture and mix with chopped lettuce.

California Salad.

Two cups white or red California grapes, one cup pecan or other nut meats. Skin and seed grapes, slice nuts and add French dressing.

Date Salad

One pound of dates, two sliced bananas, four oranges cut in small pieces juice of one lemon. Serve on lettuce eaves with mayonnaise dressing

Grapefruit Salad.

Take out inside of grapefruit and ut edge of skin into points. Slice meat of fruit with 2 oranges, 1 cup chopped nut meats, 1 diced apple, the juice of 1 lemon and 3 tablespoons powdered sugar. Fill shell and serve with the following dressing:

Beat the yolks of 2 eggs until creamy, then add to them 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard and same quantity salt. Beat in slowly 4 tablespoons melted butter and 6 tablespoons of vinegar. Cook in double boiler till it thickens When cold, and pust before serving, 1 cup of cream, either sweet or sour, may be folded in.

Spiced Beet Salad.

Let sliced cold cooked beets stand over night in vinegar, then in the morning put them over the fire with the vinegar, a short piece of stick cinnamon, 1 clove and a pinch of mace; allow to boil for five minutes, then set aside to cool in the liquid. When cold drain and serve on lettuce with French

One grapefruit, 2 oranges, 2 eggs, 1

lettuce. Place sections of grapefruit and or anges in dish on lettuce leaves, boil eggs hard, put yolks through dicer, sprinkle over salad, cut whites of eggs in rings, placing around edge of salad. In centre put balls of cream
