Beaded stockings are something entirely different. They usually come in a light-colored silk with an opening which extends from the toe to a point half-way above the angle. ROMPERS FOR KIDDIES.

Rompers or bloomer dresses, made of good quality unbleached cotton cloth and trimmed with colored braid smocked with color or embroidered, are very pretty and stylish looking as well as most practical. MAKING DARK CAKE.

When making chocolate cakes put the chocolate to melt over hot water before creaming the butter, then add the sugar mixture to insure a good color. For a dark fruit cake it should be added to the mixture just before the cake is put into the pan.

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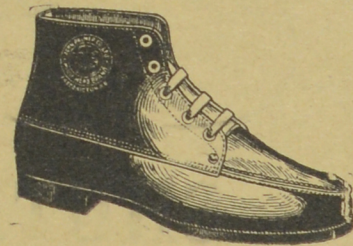
