## PARIS SPRING FASHION DISPLAY

Paris, Jan. 20—The advance guard of the spring fashion offensive arrived in Paris Thursday, when the dress-making establishment of Gabrielle Chanel held its opening fully two weeks in advance of the date announced for other grand openings. The Chanel display, however, revealed no striking changes. Skirts will be as short as ever, especially those of day dresses.

On the other hand evening dresses make some pretense of adding a few inches to the length of the skirts, inasmuch as these skirts are made principally of laces and embroidered tulle, with the overskirt hanging three or four inches below the foundation skirt.

An extended hip, emphasizing the popularity of the anniers of last season, is a marked feature of the Chanel models. Soft chiffon frills and jabots hanging from the waist line express in a majority of cases hip movements although Chanel shows some models with heel hoops over the hoops.

Stripes and checks in novelty fabrics again were featured, although checks were not as pronounced as they were in the winter models. Indeed checks have the appearance of fading into the background, while stripes are brought forward in bright colors, to look as if they were embroidered on fabric.

## JULY 18 DATE OF AMERICA CUP YACHT RACES

The Papers Not Yet Signed Between the Royal Ulster Y. C. and the New York Y. C.

New York, Jan. 20—The New York Yacht Club will defend America's Cup in a race against Sir Thomas Lipton's Shamrock IV off Sandy Hook about July 18.

This statement was made by a responsible official of the New York club in answer to a cable from London that Sir Thomas Lipton had been notified in a private message of the acceptance of the challenge.

The New York club met last Thursday night but it was reported after the meeting that no official action had been taken on the challenge.

"Details of the race have been agreed upon practically but the papers have not been signed. There is no doubt that they will be, however, within a week or so it was said at the club."

"The challenge was accepted tentatively in 1914," it was said. "When war caused a postponement of the race that year, assurance was given the Royal Ulster Club that if it would challenge later it would be accepted."

Accept Challenge

There has been no question that the New York Yacht Club would be willing to defend the cup. Acceptance of the challenge, officially submitted several months ago, has been delayed by negotiations over the time of the race and the course. But it has been decided to stage the race in the middle of July off Sandy Hook.

## RUTH MAKES PROPHECIES

Los Angeles, Jan. 20—"Babe Ruth today told of some of the incidents of his service with the Boston Americans which do not show President Frazier in a favorable light.

Said Ruth: "Frazee is not good enough to own a club, especially one in Boston. On Ruth Day the Boston people packed the park. He reserved 1,500 seats and forced the ball players to buy tickets for their wives. After the game I was called to his office, where he thanked me. That is a fair sample of his liberality."

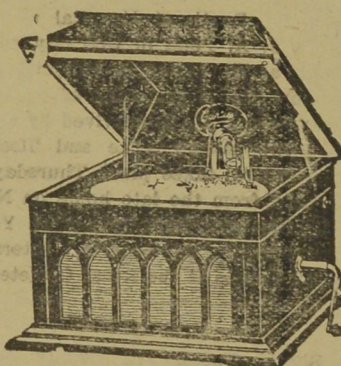
