

WORTH REMEMBERING

A raw potato will clean a rusty pen-point.

Strong ammonia water is excellent for removing iodine stains.

An old safety-razor blade is useful in taking paint spots from windows.

To keep bread or cake fresh, never put it away hot, as the steam causes it to mold.

Rusty baking tins may be cleaned with a bit of fine emery paper, dipped in flour.

When library paste or muscilage becomes hardened, mix into a few drops of vinegar.

Left-over fish can be used up and relished, by being mixed with boiled rice, made into cakes dipped in beaten egg, and fried.

To save wear on your garbage can, always cover the bottom with common salt, before putting in garbage during cold weather.

For coffee stains, cover liberally with borax and pour boiling water from a height upon the stain.

Learn to keep the lips closed, but not pressed firmly together or drawn down at the corners. Don't have a perpetual smile but cultivate a pleasant expression and the corners of your mouth will incline up instead of down.

If you have nothing better at hand, the juice of a lemon and salt will remove an ink spot from white goods. Saturate spot with lemon juice and in a little salt. Set in the sun, or press, lightly with a warm iron. Wash out.

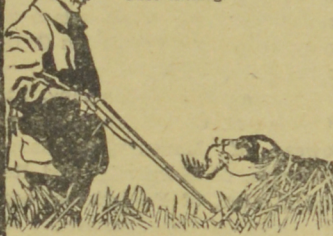
