Kansas City, Mo., Feb. 6.—Tom Bundy, negro, 23, has confessed, police said today, that he killed his father, Joe Bundy with an axe because of a voodoo doctor's revelations.

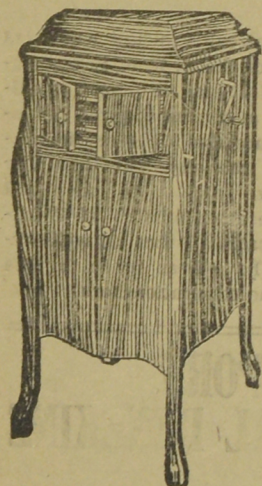
