Satisfied with Work at
Pumping Station —
Expert of Canadian
Fairbanks Morse here
to Instal Unit.

F. A. Barbour of Boston, consulting engineer for the City of Fredericton, on the installation of the new oil-engined unit at the pumping station, arrived here Tuesday afternoon and registered at the Queen Hotel. This morning Mr. Barbour conferred with City Engineer G. C. McDowell and with Ald. W. L. Jennings, chairman of the Water Committee. He also inspected the work which had been done so far in connection with the installation.

Expressed Satisfaction.

Mr. Barbour expressed satisfaction with the work which had been done, Forbes & Brown having had the contract for the building and The Canadian Fairbanks Morse Limited for the installation of the unit. This is not the final inspection by Mr. Barbour as some time will expire before the work is completed.

The expert sent by the Canadian Fairbanks Morse Limited to make the installation and to start the unit in operation is also here. He is to start his work at once. The unit was placed on its base prior to his arrival but he has to place it in its exact position and have it in perfect running order. This will take some time.

PRESENTATION BY BOARD
OF HEALTH TO DR. J. A. WADE
ON HIS RETIREMENT

Silver Mounted Cane Given and Address Read by
Mrs. A. J. Wheeler, Secretary of the Board—
Suitable Reply by Dr. Wade—Estimate for
Public Health Purposes in City the Same for
Next Year—Officials Reappointed.

The Board of Health of the Fredericton Sub-district at its last meeting held Tuesday night took the opportunity to make a presentation to Dr. J. A. Wade who with the present month and year completes his service as District Medical Health Officer for the Western District of New Brunswick. The Board presented an address and a silver mounted cane, the presentation being made by the secretary Mrs. A. J. Wheeler who also read the address. Dr. Wade replied suitably to the presentation. As he occupied the position of chairman of the Fredericton Sub-district by virtue of his office, the Board was bidding farewell to its chairman. Dr. O. E. Morehouse who is to succeed him as District Medical Health Officer was present.

Native of Fredericton.

Dr. Wade is a native of Fredericton having been born in a house in Brunswick street about opposite the residence of W. A. VanWart, Brunswick street. His father was a native of Penniac and the doctor has numerous relatives of the name in Penniac and vicinity. He entered the University of New Brunswick in 1870 and was graduated in 1873. Soon afterwards he entered the medical school of Bowdoin University in Maine and was graduated in 1877. He practiced in Charlotte County and elsewhere. Upon the organization of New Brunswick under the Public Health Act he was appointed District Medical Health Officer. He intends to reside in Fredericton.

The Address.

The address presented to Dr. Wade was as follows:—
Dr. J. A. Wade,
District Medical Health Officer and
Chairman of Sub-District Board
of Health, Fredericton.

Dear Sir:—We, the members of the Sub-District Board of Health of the city, having learned of your voluntary retirement from the official positions which you have occupied with such conspicuous ability and application during the past seven years, take this

opportunity of expressing our sincere regret that our official relations are soon to be severed.

Without intending any flattery to you, we desire to record our profound conviction that the positions you have held have been administered with a fidelity and regard for the public weal that challenge admiration and have been beyond criticism.

That your valuable services have been recognized and appreciated by the government is evidenced by the fact that for several months after you expressed a desire to relinquish your official duties you were requested by the Executive of the Province to remain in the Public Health service.

May we be permitted to observe that the relations between you and the members and officials of this Board have always been extremely pleasant and satisfactory, and it is with heartfelt regret that we witness the severance of those friendly ties.

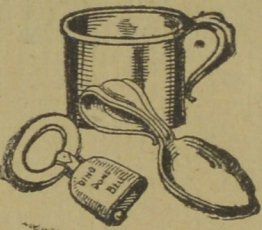

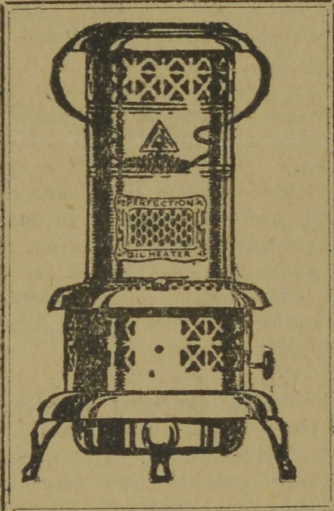
