

**GOOD POINTS TO KNOW.**

When a broom begins to show signs of wear don't throw it away. First of all soak it in hot suds, rinse and put out into the air to dry. Then cut the bristles so they are even lengths again and you will find that the broom has taken a new lease on life.

After using a bowl of starch do not throw away what is left. Put the basin on one side and when the starch has dropped to the bottom pour off the water. Place the basin in the oven for five minutes. The starch will be found in hard cakes and can be put away ready for use another day.

Many accidents have occurred from falling out of a bath onto a slippery floor. One misstep may easily result in a broken rib. A great safeguard against this danger is to have cork or india rubber matting laid along the side of the bath.

**PINEAPPLE SNOW.**

Drain the syrup from one can of pineapple bring it to a boil and add two tablespoons of cornstarch moistened with a little cold juice. Mash the pineapple to a pulp and beat it into the thickened juice. Beat the whites of two eggs and fold in lightly. Pour into a mold, set on ice and serve with whipped cream.

**PINEAPPLE SHORTCAKE.**

One cup of sugar, one cup of sweet milk, one egg, butter the size of an egg, two large cups of flour, one heaping teaspoon baking powder, shredded pineapple. Cream the butter and sugar and add the milk, the well beaten egg and the flour sifted in with the baking powder and a pinch of salt. Bake in layer cake tins. When cool cover with shredded pineapple and serve with whipped cream.
