

STOLEN CAR  
AND ELOPMENT  
BECAME MIXED

Discovery of Car Near  
Barker's Point Led to  
Arrest of a Married  
Woman and Boy.

The Star car, 1924 model, owned by Alfred Leger of Mount Carmel, Kent County, and registered under No. 6,677, was brought into Fredericton early this morning from the spot on the Richibucto Road some distance outside Barker's Point where it was first located Monday morning. The car which was abandoned evidently Sunday night was stolen from the owner Saturday night the Fredericton police being notified Sunday morning by Sheriff Basile J. Johnson of Kent County. The steering gear of the car is broken but otherwise it is all right. The car was abandoned because of gas running out. Appearances point to the car coming from the direction of Minto. No clue to the thief has been found.

Interrupted Elopement.

In connection with the abandoning of the car Mrs. Millie Parker of Pleasant Villa near Queensdown, Queen's County, aged thirty-nine, and George Forsythe a young Scotch boy aged seventeen years, were arrested this morning at the Depot House, Devon, where they had registered as man and wife. They denied any knowledge of the abandoned car although they had been seen in the vicinity on Tuesday. Their explanation of that fact was that at the South Devon C. N. R. station on Tuesday they were told by an acquaintance of Mrs. Parker's that the police were looking for them and they fled out the Richibucto Road without knowing where they were going. By chance they stopped in the vicinity of the car and Forsythe changed his clothes in the woods.

Have Wandered Three Weeks.

Mrs. Parker and Forsythe are held here as C. T. Harrison, Clerk of the Peace for Queen's County, had instructed the police that the woman was wanted for deserting her husband Fred H. Parker and her children. The couple eloped three weeks ago tomorrow and since that time have been in Saint John, Fredericton, Millville, Plaster Rock, Maple Grove and Devon. A public car of this city drove them to Maple Grove and back Mrs. Parker having friends there. Young Forsythe came out from Scotland to the Cossar Farm, Upperagetown and after leaving there hired with Parker as a farm hand.

TWO DECREES  
OF DIVORCE ARE  
GRANTED

One in Gunter Case in  
This City, and One in  
Moncton Case—Pickard Case Considered.

Mr. Justice Crocket in the New Brunswick Court of Divorce and Matrimonial has granted two decrees of divorce "a vinculo matrimonii" since the July term opened Tuesday morning. Tuesday afternoon the judge ordered a decree to issue in the Gunter case, the plaintiff husband in which resides in Fredericton and the defendant wife in Harvey Station. The other was in the Kiersstead case from Moncton. In the other York County Case, Pickard vs Pickard, the defendant husband in which resides in Parish of Dumfries, court considers.

Gunter vs Gunter.

Louis Franklyn Gunter vs Alma Gunter, was tried Tuesday afternoon. The allegation in this was misconduct at Somerville, Mass., and other places in Massachusetts, also the birth of a child by the defendant January 20, 1925, having parted from the husband in November 1923. Witnesses examined were George W. Byron Acting Deputy Provincial Secretary, who proved the qualification of Rev. F. A. Wightman to solemnize marriage, Rev. Mr. Wightman who proved the marriage, the plaintiff husband who told of facts of the married life and Dr. B. H. Dougan of Harvey Station who proved the birth of the child. NEW HIGH SCHOOL  
TO GET CONCRETE  
WALKS AFTER ALL

"Off Again! On Again!  
Gone Again!" Seems  
to be Principle of City  
Council.

"Off again! On Again! Gone Again! Finnegan," appears to be the principle on which the City Council acts with regard to laying concrete sidewalk on the street frontage of the new High School. In committee Monday night the Council decided that an overexpenditure on concrete sidewalks would be made sufficient to lay concrete sidewalk in George in front of the new building and on its Regent street frontage from George street to Brunswick street. Tuesday night in regular session the Council by a vote of seven to one decided that there would be no overexpenditure the Finance Committee having recommended against it. This morning the Council got together informally and a majority decided that the sidewalk was necessary and will be laid.

This morning His Worship Mayor Phillips and the Street Committee gathered and viewed sidewalks on the two frontages of the new school. They decided that on Regent street the asphalt walk should be replaced in concrete.

The Finance Committee was approached in the matter and after inspecting the site agreed that the work should be done although overexpenditure were to be frowned down on in general. The understanding is however that no overexpenditure for sidewalks is to be incurred except for that particular work.
