**LIVELY DEBATE EXPECTED WHEN HOUSE ASSEMBLES AT OTTAWA; THE LIBERALS EAGER FOR TEST VOTE**

Montreal, Dec. 14—An Ottawa special to The Star says:

"When parliament assembles on Jan. 7, the re-election of Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux as Speaker will be proposed by the government.

"This may be seized as the occasion for the Conservative challenge to the right of the King Ministry to carry on, but more probably it will develop later.

"The indications are that the debate on the address will hinge largely upon the constitutional position and whether a government really exists under the circumstances, and if so it has the right to power.

**Precedents Searched for**  
"At the present time there is much search for precedents or analogous cases.

"Conservatives will claim that when parliament meets in the absence of the Prime Minister through failure to be elected the Government as a matter of fact will lapse.

"The opposite position, of course, will be taken by the acting Liberal leader, who will maintain that at all times there must be government, but that it is the privilege of the opposition instantly to challenge the right

of any ministry to hold office and to allow parliament, which is supreme to decide the question. A government, at best, is only an executive committee of the House.

**Assault Will be Long**

"Liberals are anxious that the test vote be taken as soon as possible—the first day would be to their liking, but the intimation from the Conservative side has been that the debate is likely to be long, with the ministry subjected to assault for holding on when its group is inferior and when the popular vote registered a majority against it.

"The Opposition may also move the adjournment of the House and make a test vote on that motion or it may submit a general motion of non-confidence and debate it at length.

"Apropos of the presence here of Messrs. Marler and Massey, the explanation is made that since resigning they have attended no cabinet council. They have been in consultation with the Premier and Mr. Robb.

"Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen goes west tonight to foregather with Conservatives of Portage la Prairie in celebration of his election in that constituency."

**COUNCILLORS SOLD GOODS TO THE TOWN**

Windsor, Dec. 14—A mild sensation in municipal circles developed at this week's session of the Windsor Town Council, when two members of that body resigned their positions. The resigning councillors are Harold G. B. Wilcox, a member of the firm of Wilcox Bros., hardware merchants, and Ira B. Lohnes, undertaker.

The resignations followed the report of the quarterly audit of town accounts by B. S. Barnes, and C. H. Brown, who reported that they found two bills from the firm of Wilcox Bros., among the Town accounts, and who reminded the Council of the section in the Town's Incorporation Act, which prohibits members of the Council from entering into any contract for the supplying of goods or material, or the performance of the work or labor for or to the Town. One of the bills was for \$56.59, and the other for \$116.36.

Mr. Wilcox's resignation expressed regret at the circumstances which necessitating his resigning, which he told the council had occurred "unwillingly and unsolicited" on his part.

**NINE COMETS ARE VISIBLE IN CHICAGO**

Chicago, Dec. 12—This year is an open season for comets. Nine of them are now visible through telescopes at the Yerkes observatory of the University of Chicago and are at present under observation.

Prof. Edwin B. Frost, director for 20 years, says another astral marauder, Tuttle's comet, may be located before the close of the year. He explains that the planets move under the gravitational control of the sun.

Among the comets under observation are a new one discovered by Prof. G. Van Biesbroeck of the university staff when he was looking for a comet first visible in Poland and a comet located by an amateur astronomer, Pelletier, of Delphos, O. The latter is said to be moving across the sky four degrees a day and would be visible to the naked eye if it would brighten up in a moonless sky.

**ICE HOCKEY IN CALIFORNIA**

Lloyd Cook, former star defence man on the Vancouver professional hockey team, is now cavorting around the picture colony of California, having signed up as playing manager of the Hollywood Athletic Club in the hockey series which is already under way in the south.

The returns suggest that New York's new 125-pound Mayor was no lightweight candidate.

**IMMIGRATION AGREEMENT HAS BEEN APPROVED**

London, Dec. 14—The new overseas settlement agreement between Canada and Great Britain has been signed and will be published later in the week/according to information obtained by the Canadian Press.

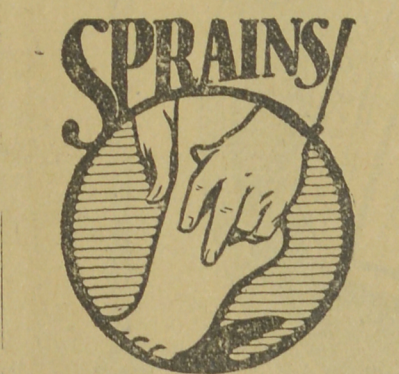
While the details of the new immigration agreement are being withheld for the time being, the Canadian Press is credibly informed that the main feature thereof will disclose the fact that a substantial reduction has been made in the amount of money which an approved emigrant from Great Britain to Canada will have to put up under the assisted passage scheme.

The agreement involves larger payments by the two governments. The emigrants themselves will furnish approximately £3 10s. each for passage to Halifax, £5 to Winnipeg, £7 to Edmonton and £9 to Vancouver.

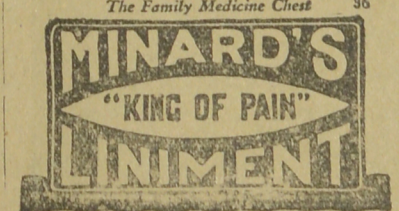
Of the extra amount required the British government is to provide the greater part.
