COLOR IS THE DOMINANT ISSUE IN PARIS YULETIDE JEWELRY.

Green Is the Smartest Hue; Emeralds Featured in Vanities, Rings and Brooches; Wrist Watches Have Jeweled Bracelets.

(New York Herald-Tribune.)

Nowhere in the realm of Christmas gifts is the personal element so strong as in jewelry. Jewels in themselves are surrounded with a long history of romance and imperishable fascination, and the jeweled article not only reflects this romantic background, but carries with it also a sentimental significance and permanence which gives it an especial place in the regard of the recipient.

This year the masterpieces of the jeweler's art are lovelier than ever before, adding, as they do, to artistry of design, a new and modern note of color. Following perhaps the brilliance of the feminine mode in costume, fashionable jewelry employs to a greater extent than ever this element of color. Emeralds and rubies gleam among the more conventional brilliants in combinations of rare beauty. The note of green is particularly favored, being reflected in precious stones by the emerald and in the semi-precious range by jade.

Among the newer notes in jewelry, according to Cartier, the international authority, are wide bracelets with buckle effects. These are composed of pure brilliants and usually employ a colored stone in the buckle. Emerald is most often chosen for this purpose. The link bracelet composed of links of brilliants, sometimes with a faint line of black enamel adding a delicate accent, is a type of adornment which also finds favor.

Colorful Bead Bracelets.

An interesting expression of the vogue of color in jewelry is found in the new bead bracelets composed of polished emerald or ruby beads with diamond ornaments or clasps. A particularly beautiful bracelet of this character shows in the center large carved emerald beads separated by rondels of brilliants, and has end sections of small pearls. Necklaces are also composed of long strands of carved or polished emeralds or rubies. A pleasing fashion is the use of these necklaces or chokers worn with matching bracelets of emerald or ruby beads. To further carry out this idea of color in jewelry in the semi-precious range there are bead bracelets of coral, onyx and jade. Very often the jade beads have pearls in between.

The ear pendant again acclaims the note of color which runs as a recurring theme through jewelry this year. Ear pendants composed of jade, crystal or coral drops are suitable for wear with evening gowns, matching or contrasting in color with these.

Double Stone Rings.

Rings have always an especial place and significance in the feminine mind. Emeralds and brilliants still hold first place in rings, and the ruby is also in favor. Double stone rings are popular this season, and are shown in combinations of brilliant and emerald, sapphire and brilliant, ruby and brilliant.

Wrist watches remain the standard of favor, although the pendant watch is also proving very popular. A new note in jeweled wrist watches this year is the utilization of colored stones like emeralds or rubies in combination with brilliants. There is also a notable tendency toward jeweled bracelets with wrist watches.

TALKS OF COACHES

The four seasons of drubbing handed University of Toronto in football has the big college all agog. The Toronto Globe discusses the question thuswise:—

"There can be no doubt of the sentiment of the student body at University of Toronto, as represented by the large and keenly enthusiastic attendance at the recent debate on the matter of pro. coaching for the football team. The sweeping decision in favor of the employment of a professional coach does not necessarily mean that one will be employed. That is a matter that is now squarely up to the U. of T. Athletic Directorate. Out of the whole matter arises the question, 'Would the proposal to engage a professional coach have arisen had University of Toronto won the Intercollegiate championship for four years under an amateur coach and the national championship for three years under an amateur coach and the national championship for three years as has Queen's under a paid mentor?' The point is made that players who go upon the field in the reasonable certainty that they are going to be beaten are not imbued with the do-or-die spirit so necessary in every day life as in sport. After all 'the game's the thing,' not the winning of it, but the effect upon the game, and its participants must be considered. The attitude of the Athletic Directorate is awaited with widespread interest in sport circles because of the principle involved.
