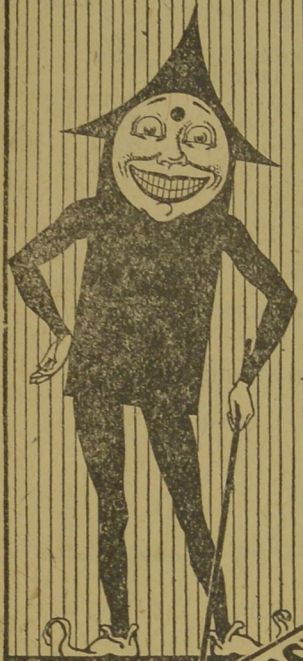

PARIS FASHIONS

The low cut slipper is the smartest type in Paris and the cut is graded according to the occasion. In the afternoon the models are less cut out and they are comparatively simple, while for evenings low cut outs and elaborate ornamentation conform to the latest dicta. Veauvelours a very supple species of calf is Perugia's newest leather conception and it is decorated along futuristic lines. Two and tritone treatments of brown and green are sponsored as well by this shoe creator. Satins in black and dyed to match the costume are also being worn in Paris and patent leathers notably in a coppery hue are another sanctioned part of the winter picture.

There is a decided effort in Paris to further the use of fine cottons for Biarritz wear as well as spring and summer. Voiles, either in plain colors or elaborately printed, and embroidered net are the leading cotton fabrics offered and while each of these materials will undoubtedly be seen in many frocks when the Royal Poinciana opens its doors we do not believe that cotton will recover anything like its former prestige this season.

The long straight coat and the bolero type short coat are the most significant features of the winter costume suits shown at the initial showing of the season and the complication of the silhouette is no longer confined to the hemline.

PUT EFFICACY INTO HOUSEHOLD AFFAIRS.

Clean the sink with soap or fine abrasives. They do not spoil the glaze on the porcelain.

Rag rugs can be cleaned in the washing machine with plenty of suds, changed frequently and a good deal of rinsing. They can be hung straight on the line and if possible a hose turned on them for a final rinsing.

If there is no washing machine, have plenty of thick dry suds and scrub them well into the rug with a stiff brush. Rinse thoroughly and quickly by rubbing with cloths squeezed out of clear water. Put a few drops of ammonia in the last rinse water.

Baking is the best method of cooking vegetables because it retains as much as possible of the food value. Steaming is next but some vegetables lose color and develop a strong odor when steamed. In boiling, however, a large percentage of food value is lost through cooking in a good deal of water and later pouring that water off.

Protect your porch furniture before putting it away for the winter by giving it a coat of hot "boiled" linseed oil. Allow the oil to soak into the furniture for half an hour, then rub well with a clean, dry cloth.

PEANUT DAINTIES.

These peanut butter cookies are excellent for party refreshments and may be quickly made:

½ pound peanut butter (1 cup)
½ pound powdered sugar (1½ cup)
4 egg whites (unbeaten).

Cream together and drop the mixture in small spoonful on parchment paper. Bake in a moderate oven—350 degrees—for twenty minutes.

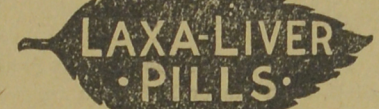

SAUCE FOR CHEESE TIMBALES.

½ cup milk
1 teaspoon butter
1½ teaspoon flour
2 tablespoons grated cheese
¾ teaspoon salt

Melt butter, add flour, and stir to a smooth paste. Add milk slowly then salt and cheese. Cook for about five minutes in top of double boiler and then pour over timbales just before serving.
