Provincial Chapter In-
structed Concerning
Queen's Funeral —
Governor Notified of
Court Mourning.

The Provincial Chapter, Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, has received from the Head Office, Toronto, a telegram relating to cancellation of activities of the Order until after the burial of Her Late Majesty Queen Alexandra. The telegram which is to be forwarded to all subordinate chapters is as follows:—

"Instruct chapters under your jurisdiction to postpone all I. O. D. E. functions until after funeral of Queen Mother, November 28th."

In accordance with this message the Provincial Chapter asks that this request be complied with as a mark of respect to the late Queen Mother.

Court Mourning.
R. S. Barker, Official Secretary to His Honor the Lieut. Governor on Monday received official instructions concerning mourning for the death of Her Late Majesty Queen Alexandra the instructions having been given through the Under Secretary of State.

The text of the telegram is as follows:—

To The Lieut. Governor of New Brunswick, Fredericton, N. B.
His Majesty the King has commanded that the Court wear mourning three months for Her Late Majesty Queen Alexandra, from November 20th. Half mourning January 20th to February 20th.

Old Time Marriage.
The following marriage notice is published by the Halifax Recorder from its files of November 19, 1825: "At Beaubair's Island, Miramichi on Saturday the 22nd ult., by the Rev. Samuel Bacon, John Fraser, Esq., to Miss Margaret Fraser, of Montreal." (The late Hon. James Fraser, a son born of this union was long a leading citizen of Fredericton and eventually became Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick.)

Egg Laying Contest.
A York County pen, owned by Mr. John Moore of Scotch Lake carried off the honors in the New Brunswick egg-laying contest last week. This pen produced 29 eggs all of which seem to have been well up to the maximum weight. The pen of Mr. Morris Steven of Hoyt also made a good showing with 26 eggs and now leads the contest with 44.3 points. A. T. Reid's pen produced 22 eggs and dropped from first to second place. The pen of Fred H. Ferguson of this city also produced 22 eggs and now stands fourth in the contest with 30.2 points.

ADDITIONAL CHAIR OF
PHYSICS TO BE ESTABLISHED
AT UNIVERSITY NEXT YEAR

Senate Decided Upon This at Annual Meeting
Held Today—Will Strengthen Electrical En-
gineering Department—Chancellor's Report
Commented on Large Enrolment of Students
—Committee to Consider Entire Matter of
Library.

The Senate of the University of New Brunswick met in annual session in the Education Office this morning and transacted much business of importance to the university. Chief among the items was the decision to establish a Chair of Physics at the university for the next academic year which will open in September next.

Additional Chair.

This action was taken at the instance of the Chancellor Dr. C. C. Jones, who brought up the need of an additional chair in the Department of Physics and Electrical Engineering. Prof. A. F. Baird at present occupies the chair of that Department. The new chair will relieve him of some of his present carried on by Prof. John Stephens as professor of Mechanical Engineering and Drawing.

Deficit on Year.

The university accounts for the year were presented, a deficit on operation being shown. A committee was named to confer with the Provincial Government on university finances the committee having full powers to make suggestions in that regard.

Large Enrollment.

The report of the Chancellor on the condition of the university was presented. The chief feature was the registration of a record number of new students this year and the largest enrolment of undergraduates on record.

No Increase in Fees.

The committee appointed to consider the matter of fees reported that no increase in fees be recommended. This committee was appointed on the suggestion of Dr. Trueman, president of Mt. Allison University, who had suggested an increase in fees particularly in Law.

Reports Received.

The proposals of Sir George E. Foster with regard to establishing and endowment fund for the university were placed before the Senate. Prof. John Stephens reported on the heating of the Memorial Building. His report was laid on the table for consideration at the meeting in May.

J. B. McNair reported on the expenses of the Reunion of 1925 and a balance was ordered paid.

C. McN. Steeves reported on the Emergency Building Fund.

Dr. W. D. Rankin was appointed to the Finance Committee in the place of Col. Murray MacLaren, M. P., resigned.

Library Committee.

The matter of appointing a special librarian was considered and a committee was appointed to report on the entire matter of the university library.

The committee is composed of C. McN. Steeves, Mrs. J. E. Page and His Honor Judge Crockett.

The proposal that a safety vault be installed and also that a concrete floor be laid in the basement of the Arts Building was referred to a special committee C. McN. Steeves, B. M. Hill and the Chancellor being named the committee.

Those Attending.

Those in attendance at the meeting were Dr. W. S. Carter, chairman, B. M. Hill, Dr. W. D. Rankin, C. McN. Steeves, George J. Marr, Sir Douglas Hazen, Chief Justice J. H. Barry, Mrs. J. E. Page, Miss Ethel Anderson, Chancellor Jones, Hon. C. D. Richards and Havelock Coy the registrar. The Senate met again at 2.30 p. m. at the Arts Building of the University.

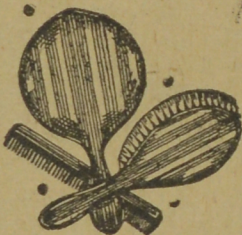
