Ritual of "Barsom."

The Zoroastrian worship from which barred, consists chiefly of the recita tion of fragments of the sacred books together with the performance of certain ritual, or without it. In the ritual, "barsom" (a bundle of from five to thirty-five metallic wires, tied with a string of date leaf), a metallic saucer, with nine holes in the middle, and cups and dishes are used. Offerings of holy water, sacred bread, fragrant wood and certain plants are made.

Devout Parsees usually go to the fire table every day-always on certain days of the month.
