

ROADS DRIFTED CARS WRECKED, BY OCTOBER SNOW

Three-foot Drifts Above Woodstock—Runners Used in New Maryland—Deep Snow Elsewhere.

The storm of the week-end according to reports coming in from surrounding country left deep snow on the high lands but along the Saint John River the fall was light. Local motorists who left for Houlton Sunday could not get beyond Woodstock because of heavy drifts from which they had to be pulled by horses.

Milkman on Runners.

In New Maryland only five miles from Fredericton sleds were in general use after the storm and one milkman on Sunday brought his milk to Fredericton on runners.

Cardigan, Woodland and Stanley in the northern part of York County all had heavy snow. Reports from other places are similar.

Cars Abandoned.

Motorists who tried the Broad Road in the vicinity of Geary say that cars could be seen at various places along the road abandoned with wheels broken and other damage. The snow in places was deep enough to be around the radiators.

T. V. Monohan was one of the motorists who was stuck between Woodstock and Houlton. He says his car encountered drifts three feet deep.

Autumn Leaves and Snow.

Locally Saturday night's snow stayed on the ground Sunday and gave the city an odd appearance as autumn were on many trees although the ground was white with snow. As the day wore on the snow melted but the freezing temperature of last night kept some on the ground until today.

The Saint John River is rising and some tributaries are at freshet height.

LUMBER ON MILL YARDS ONE THIRD OF LAST YEAR'S

Woods Operations Well Under Way—Extensive as Usual—Lath and Lumber Market Up.

It is estimated that throughout New Brunswick the quantity carried on the mill yards at this time is only about one third of what it was a year ago. This is said to be the result of a gradual improvement in conditions and a moving out of manufactured stock. From the North Shore there have been large shipments by steamer to British ports and from the south of the province the American market has been taking lumber in steady quantity.

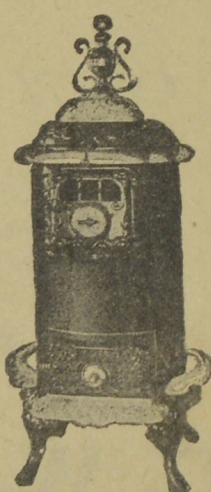
