Heat 1 pint milk. Mix 2 ounces chocolate or 2 teaspoons cocoa with 1-2 cup sugar and 1 1-2 teaspoon: cornstarch, wet with little milk and cook till mixture coats spoon. Line molds or teacups with thin slices of sponge cake, pour in the cream and set in cool place to harden. When ready to serve invert on saucer and cover with whipped


