PROTECTING THE FORESTS.

All smoking has been forbidden : the Kootenai national forest which is located in Montana. Only by special permit may camp fires be built. The stringent rules have been put in force because of the increase in forest fires there. What the regulations show is that warnings, urgings, appeals and the recitation of past experiences have not been sufficient to check the carelessnss of tourists and campers Matches and cigar ends are thrown thoughtlessly about. 
